

Monday 3rd of Aug 1868

Shore 24 hours commenced with light winds from the N or bent over old gear and main top-sail and bent the new ones at 4 p.m. saw two right whales boarded and chased a spell at 9 came on board at day light saw a large number of whales boarded and the waist boat struck and the line got foul and took the boat down struck him a gain latter part took him a long side so ends

Lat 56.42 Lon 167.50

Tuesday 4th Shore 24 hours commenced with light winds from the W employed in cutting at 8 finished middle part commenced to boil middle and latter part foggy

Wednesday 5th Shore 24 hours commenced with light winds from the W a heaving to the S employed in boiling middle part clear latter part foggy so ends

Lat 56.40 Lon 167.58

Thursday 6th Shore 24 hours commenced with strong winds and rainy employed in boiling at 4 p.m. saw a whale boarded and the waist boat struck and the crew drew and lost the whale came on board so ends one sail in sight

Lat 56.30 Lon 167.56

Friday 7th Shore 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the N first part saw a whale boarded and chased at 9 came on board took in jib and fore sail at day light more moderate commenced to stow down latter part fine saw two sails

Lat 56.43 Lon 168.10

Saturday 8th of Aug 1868

Shore 24 hours commenced with light winds from the N a heaving to the S at 3 p.m. finished boiling employed in stowing down in the main hatch at 4 started stowing at day light saw a whale boarded three boats and the whale started to the windward came on board at 11 p.m. boarded a gain and the starboard boat struck and the whale run to the windward saw the islander get a whale so ends

Lat 56.20 Lon 158.00

Sunday 9th Shore 24 hours commenced with strong winds the whale run and set the boat to leeward so ends that it took two men to cap her free at 4 p.m. the line was cut by the spade while spading the whale came on board latter part strong winds so ends

Lat 56.18 Lon 158.07

Monday 10th Shore 24 hours commenced with strong winds and rising winds from the S W under short sail middle part the same latter part took in gill and spanker a heaving to the S

Tuesday 11th Shore 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the S W at day light saw a right whale boarded two boats and the waist boat struck and rolled the boat over and the whale run to the windward and lost him latter part rainy
