There are hours commences with moderate winds from the E and a thick foggy with rain middle part clear latter part strong winds from the S.W. & heading to the S.E. no ends

Thursday 24 of these hours commences with strong winds from the S.W. & heading to the S.E. at 2 p.m. saw the island of St. Pauls middle part fine at 3 a.m. spook the bark Alto and let her have thirty bbls of water latter part fine saw three sail

Lat 54° 30' "

Friday 25 There are hours commences with light winds from the S.W. & heading to the S.E. all sail set at 8 p.m. spook the Bk Yaw and saw several ships employed in breaking ought for water no ends calms

Lat 54° 25' "

Saturday 26 There are hours commences with calms at 7 p.m. light winds from the S. saw the island of St. Pauls dist twenty miles & bearing N.E. middle part fine at 8 a.m. saw whales loared all four boats and chaired but with ought nuxen whales very shy saw the George cut a whale no ends

Sunday 27 of Sept

There are hours commences with light winds from the S. saw eight ships & whaling and saw the Frydens take a whale middle and latter part calms saw eight sail

Lat 54° 30' Long 141° 50'

Monday 28 There are hours commences with light winds from the S. & heading to the S. at 6 p.m.

spook the islander and gary middle part fine latter part the same & heading to the S.E. saw eight sail

Lat 54° 00' "

Tuesday 29 There are hours commences with light winds from the N.E. & heading to the S.E. middle part strong winds with rain latter part more wind took in the gills & heading to the N. saw one sail no ends

Wednesday 30 There are hours commences with strong winds from the S. & heading to the N.E. at under short sail at 8 p.m. saw St. Pauls dist ten miles at 6 a.m. ship to the S.E. middle part calms latter part the same

Lat 54° 10' Long

Thursday 1 of Oct 1868

There are hours commences with light winds from the E at 5 loared for a right whale but came in dark came on board middle part rainy latter part moderate winds from the N. & heading to the S.E. spook the gary no ends saw St. Pauls dist ten miles
