from the N. a steering S.E. by E.
all hands employed in washing
bone middle part strong winds
from the N.E. latter part finished
finished cure bone and lashed
it on deck so ends

part calms all hands employed in
washing ship so ends

S.E. finished washing ship
in side middle part fine

the N.E. a steering S.E. the watch
employed in washing ship
a sail in sight a steering S.E.
middle part calms latter part employed
in drying bone and scraping bone
one sail in sight

Sunday 18 Shine 24 hours
commences with light winds from
the S.W. middle part calms
at 8 a.m. the capt of the Nautilus
came on board employed in
drying bone light winds from
the W. a heading S. sharp by
