Saturday 2 These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the N.W. a strong E.S.E. middle part rainy. latter part strong winds so ends.

Lat by D.R. 47.40 L 130.10

Sunday 3 These 24 hours commences with moderate winds from the W. a strong E. first part saw two very large ice bergs some five hundred feet high. latter part saw two more steers E.N.E. winds from the N. with rain.

Lat by D.R. 48.50 L 128.00

Monday 4 These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the N. a strong E.S.E. took in light sail and doubled reefed middle part took in the main sail and gale. latter part a blowing a gale pumping ship every hour a heaving two thousand strokes per minute so ends.

Lat 49.10 L 109.20

Tuesday 5 These 24 hours January 1859 commences with strong winds from the N. a strong E.S.E. first part set the main sail reefed middle part more moderate set all sail split the main royal a setting it. latter part foggy.

Lat by D.R. 49.07 L 118.30

Wednesday 6 These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the N.W. a strong E.S.E. a pumping ship every hour a heaving five thousand strokes per hour middle part the same. latter part winds to the W. with rain and fog so ends.

Lat by D.R. 49.14 L 114.39

Thursday 7 These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the W. a strong E.S.E. middle part rainy. latter part the same so ends.

Lat by D.R. 49.50 L 109.30

Friday 8 These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the W. a strong E.S.E. employed in breaking out water at 5 A.M. split the fore top mast standing sail bent a other one middle and latter part rainy.
