Monday 11 Shore of hours
commences with strong winds
from the S under double reefs
and reefed main sail middle part
the same latter part more moderate
winds more to the S halled sharp
by to the E no ends

Tuesday 12 Shore of hours
commences with strong winds from
the S a heading sharp by to the E
middle part strong flaps of wind
latter part light and baffly

Wednesday 13 Shore of hours
commences with light baffly
winds middle part winds from
the W steered E by S latter part
strong winds employed in
repairing the four top gun ports
and rigging

Lat 53.10 Lg 91.40

Thursday 14 of January
Shore of hours commences
with strong winds from the
W a steering E by S at 3 AM
took in main royal and reefed the
main sail middle part more
moderate latter part rainy employed
in mending the studding sails

Friday 15 Shore of hours
commences with moderate winds
from the W a steering E middle part
winds light and foggy latter part
all sail set some foggy winds more
to the W no ends

Saturday 16 Shore of hours
commences with moderate winds
from the W N W a steering E by N
middle part clear latter part
the same saw a number of
fin backs that we called sperm
whales at first no ends

Sunday 17 Shore of hours
commences with light winds from
the W a steering E by S
middle part winds light latter
part winds halled to the N W and
came in thick no ends
