

Monday 18 of January 1869  
Shore of hours commences with  
strong winds from the N a steering  
E N E first part took in light  
sail winds a breary on with rain  
at 7 took in the main sail and gill  
and doubled reefed the topsails middle  
part winds halled to the W latter  
part strong squalls set the main top  
garnisail over a single reefed main  
top sail so ends

Tuesday 19 Shore of hours  
commences with strong winds from  
the W a steering E N E at 8 p.m.  
saw cappe horn dist 10 miles  
middle part steered N N E at day  
light saw the land of the straits at  
9 a.m. entered the straits of Lemaire  
latter part fine

Wednesday 20 Shore of hours  
commences with moderate winds  
from the S W a steering N by E  
employed in putting on the  
bow and waist boat middle part  
more and halled to the S steered  
N by W latter part clear  
so ends this day

Lat 51.00 Lg 63.20

Thursday 21 of January  
Shore of hours commences  
with strong winds from the  
S a steering N by E middle  
part winds halled to the W and came  
in rainy latter part more wind winds  
from the N took in light sail  
so ends this day

No Observation

Friday 22 Shore of hours  
commences with strong winds with  
rain at 3 p.m. had a heavy  
squall from the S W the wind shifted  
sudding from the N to the S W called  
all hands and took in all sail  
at 4 more moderate set some  
sail middle part winds steady  
latter part shook on the closest  
reefs saw two two ships a heading to  
the S so ends

Lat 47.21 L 62.30

Saturday 23 Shore of hours  
commences with moderate winds  
from the S a steering N E by N  
middle part fine latter part  
the same so ends

Lat 44.47 Lg 57.12

Sunday 24 Shore of hours  
fine at 4 p.m. saw three sperm whales  
boarded three boats and the waist boat started  
and missed came on board and took  
in sail for the night at 9 p.m. saw more  
whales boarded three boats but with ought  
success whales a going to the windward  
to the N latter part fine
