rainy latter part fine

commences with strong trades
a stern N. W. by N. two sail in
sight employed in taring down
middle and latter part fine

Tuesday¹⁶ Shore of hours
commences with strong trades
a stern N. W. by N. middle part
strong trades latter part employed in
taring down the rigging

Lat 08.11 Long 45.34
Wednesday¹⁷ Shore of hours
commences with strong trades
a stern N. W. by N. middle part
fine latter part the same

Lat 10.15 Long 47.20
Thursday¹⁸ Shore of hours
commences with strong trades
a stern N. W. by N. middle part
winds light latter part
the same so ends
