winds light and three sail a strong
to the W. no ends

spanker gaff the eye bolt broke that
goes in to the mast latter part

commences with strong winds
from the N. a strong N. W. by N.
at 5 p.m. a sea struck the bow
boat and broke the dav and
lost the boat with every thing
middle part squally
latter part passed a brig
