Sunday<sup>29</sup> of March 1869

These 24 hours commenced with  
strong winds from the N<sup>o</sup> &  
steer N<sup>W</sup> by N middle part  
fine latter part the same

Sat 27<sup>o</sup> 04 L 66.49  
Monday<sup>30</sup> these 24 hours  
commenced with moderate winds  
from the N<sup>o</sup> & a steering N<sup>W</sup> by N  
at 6 pm. set standing sails middle  
part winds from the S<sup>o</sup> latter part  
winds light and baffling with rain  
employed in breaking caught water  
and trimming ship no ends

Sat 28<sup>o</sup> 31 L 67.28  
Tuesday<sup>31</sup> these 24 hours  
commenced with light winds from  
the S a steering N<sup>W</sup> by N middle  
part fine fine astounding sails set  
latter part employed in setting  
up rigging no ends

Sat 30<sup>o</sup> 26 L 68.56  
Wednesday<sup>31</sup> these 24 hours  
commenced with moderate  
winds from the S a steering  
N<sup>W</sup> by N middle part winds  
more to the W<sup>o</sup> not a p winds  
hauled to the N<sup>W</sup> with squalls  
took in light sail latter part  
employed in painting the  
houses on top row. 1<sup>o</sup> brig

Sat 32<sup>o</sup> 03 L 69.44

Thursday<sup>1</sup> of April 1869

These 24 hours commenced  
with strong winds from the  
N<sup>W</sup> by N a steering sharp by  
to the N<sup>o</sup> saw a schooner  
board N middle part strong  
winds doubled reefed the topsails  
latter part a heavy row a running  
row a) sail bound S

Sat 33<sup>o</sup> 16 L 69.14  
Friday<sup>2</sup> of April 1869  
These 24 hours commenced with  
strong winds from the N<sup>W</sup> a heading  
N under doubled reefed topsails  
middle part more moderate  
set all sail latter part winds  
hauled to the S<sup>W</sup> steered N<sup>W</sup> by N  
the watch employed in various jobs

Sat 34<sup>o</sup> 46 L 70.07  
Saturday<sup>3</sup> these 24 hours  
commenced with strong winds  
from the S<sup>W</sup> a heading N<sup>W</sup> by N  
middle part the same latter part  
winds shifted to the N suddenly  
and blowed strong took in sail  
and wore ship to the N<sup>W</sup> no ends

No observation  
Sunday<sup>4</sup> these 24 hours  
commenced with strong winds  
from the N<sup>o</sup> a steering N<sup>W</sup> by N  
first part entered the gulf middle  
part winds fluky latter part  
winds hauled to the W wore ship  
to the N<sup>o</sup> saw several sail
