Commences with moderate trade winds from the S.E. and fine weather course S.W. by S. all sail set middle part moderate breezes from the E.N.E. course S.W. by S. last part fresh breezes from the N.E. & fine weather course S.W. by S. employed about various jobs of ships duty at 9 o'clock saw a brig heading to the E.S.E. ovens

Commences with moderate breezes from the N.E. and fine weather course S.W. by S. employed about sundry jobs at 4 o'clock saw a brig heading to the E.S.E. middle part light breezes from the N.E. and fine weather last part light air from the N.E. course S.W. by S. at 11 o'clock caught a cow fish ovens

Monday January 30th

Commences with light airs from the N.E. & fine weather course S.W. by S. all sail set, saw a fin back middle part light airs from the N.E. at 1 o'clock took a fresh breeze from the S.E. at 3 o'clock in the light sails and double reefed the top sails with squalls of rain last part strong breezes from the S.E. and cloudy course S.W. by S. under double reefed top sails & courses ovens

Tuesday January 31st

Commences with strong breezes from the S.E. at 1 o'clock turned a reef out of the fore & main top sails course S.W. by S. middle part light breezes & variable course S.W. by S. last part moderate breezes from the E.S.E. course S.W. by S. all drawing sail set the watch employed about sundry jobs of ships duty got over the mast head some new main top gallant back stays ovens

Wednesday February 1st 1854

Commences with light breezes from the E.N.E. course S.W. by S. all drawing sail set the watch employed about various jobs middle part moderate breezes from the N.E. and fine weather last part fresh breezes from E.N.E. to N.E. by N. course S.W. by S. the watch employed about various jobs of ships duty ovens

Thursday February 2^d

Commences with fresh breezes from the N.W.E. course S.S.W. the watch employed about ships duty at 3 o'clock took a lunar observation Lon by June 46-11-15 West by Dec 46-16 West middle part fresh breezes from the N.W.E. course S.S.W. last part fresh breezes from the N.W.E. and thick weather course S.S.W. saw two sails heading to the N.W. ovens

Friday February 3^d

Commences with strong breezes from the N.W.E. and rugged steering S.S.W. under top sails top gallant sail & fore sail middle part thick squally weather at 11 o'clock took in the main top gallant sail & double reefed the top sails at 11 o'clock the wind changed to the N.W. with strong squalls & rain at midnight it hauled to the S.S.E. set the jib last part strong breezes from the S.S.E. and rugged heading by the wind on the larboard tack to the S.W. under double reefed top sails courses jib & spanker ovens

Lat 35-04

Saturday February 4th

Commences with strong breezes from the S.S.E. and rugged heading to the S.W. under double reefed top sails & courses middle part more moderate turned the reef out of the top sails set the main top gallant sail & fly jib heading S.W. by S. last part moderate breezes from the S.S.E. and fine weather heading up by the wind on the larboard tack S.W. the watch employed in breaking out for water ovens
