

Thursday February 15th 1854

Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. and fine weather heading up by the wind on the larboard tack S.W. the watch employed about various jobs at 4 o'clock P.M. took in the waist boat & put her over head. took a lunar observation on the line 51-25 by Dec 51-28 West middle part light breezes from S.E. to N.E. course South
Lat 37-39
Lon 51-48
last part light breezes from the N.W. and fine weather course by compass south all drawing out set occurs

Monday February 20th

Commences with light breezes from the N.W. course south at 3 o'clock P.M. took a lunar observation on the line 52-00 by Dec 51-48 W middle part fresh breezes from the N.W. course S.W. last part strong breezes from the N.W. & clear weather course S.W. all sail out the watch employed about various jobs of ships duty occurs

Tuesday February 21st

Commences with strong breezes from the N.W. and clear weather course S.W. employed about sundry jobs at sunset took in the light sails jib & main sail and double reefed the top sails with thunder & lightning middle part strong breezes from the W.S. heading up on the larboard tack south at daylight took in the fore top sail last part fresh gales from the S.W. at 11 o'clock A.M. took in the fore sail with strong squalls occurs No observations

Wednesday February 22nd

Commences with fresh gales from the S.W. heading to the S. under a close reefed main top sail fore & main spencers at sunset wore ship to the S.W. with fresh squalls middle part more moderate heading S.W. by S. last part moderate breezes from the S.E. heading up on the larboard tack S.W. the watch employed about sundry jobs of ships duty occurs

Thursday February 23rd 1854

Commences with light air from the S.E. heading to the S.W. middle part light air and variable with fine weather at 4 o'clock A.M. moderate breezes from the westward heading S.E. at 11 o'clock took ship to the S.E. with moderate breezes from the S.W. the watch employed about various jobs occurs

Friday 24th February

Commences with fresh breezes from the S.E. heading up on the larboard tack S.W. employed about various jobs middle part moderate breezes from the N.E. & fine weather last part fresh breezes from the northward course S.W. by S. employed in breaking out for water & bread at 10 o'clock A.M. sent in the fly jib boom occurs

Saturday February 25th

Commences with fresh breezes from the northward course S.W. at 3 o'clock P.M. took in the main sail at 8 took in the fore top gallant sail middle part moderate breezes from the westward and thick foggy weather heading S.W. at 10 o'clock P.M. took in the main top gallant sail & double reefed the top sails last part moderate breezes from the westward & thick foggy weather heading S.W. at 6 o'clock A.M. saw a whale ship heading to the northward at 10 o'clock A.M. turned the reefs out and set the top gallant sails occurs

Sunday February 26th

Commences with moderate breezes from the N.W. heading S.W. by S. all sail out the watch employed about various jobs at 5 o'clock P.M. spoke ship Discovery of Eschscholtz 28 miles out 24th at middle part light breezes from the westward & foggy last part light air & calm heading S.W. by S. with a thick fog occurs No observations
