

Monday March 13th 1854

Commences with moderate breezes from the N.W. and cloudy weather heading by the wind to the N.W.E. at 10 PM wore ship to the westward & double reefed the top sails with thick rainy weather middle part fresh breezes from N.W.W. heading West at 10 PM the wind hauled to the westward wore ship to the northward & turned the reef out last part light breezes from the N.W.W. at 11 PM wore ship to the westward with thick foggy weather occurs

Tuesday March 14th

Commences with light breezes from the N.W.W. heading to the westward at 2 PM the wind hauled to the westward wore ship to the westward with thick foggy weather middle part moderate breezes from West heading West with thick foggy weather at 10 PM wore ship to the W.S.W. last part fresh breezes from N.W.W. heading by the wind to the W.S.W. occurs

Wednesday March 15th

Commences with moderate breezes from N.W.W. heading to the wind on the starboard tack W.S.W. middle part moderate breezes from the S.E. and thick rainy weather steering N.W.W. all drawing sail set last part light air & calm employed in sending out the fly jib boom and various jobs of ship's duty occurs

Thursday March 16th

Commences with a calm employed in putting out the waist boat & breaking out for various articles middle part fresh breezes from S.W. to W. heading N.W.W. last part strong breezes from W.W.W. to N.W. heading by the wind on the starboard tack from N. to N.W.E. occurs

Friday March 17th 1854

Commences with fresh breezes from N.W. heading by the wind on the starboard tack from N.W.E. to W.W.E. with cloudy weather at 10 PM double reefed the top sails and wore ship to the W.S.W. middle part strong breezes from the N.W. took in the jib main sail & fore top sail & wore ship to the N.W.E. at 10 PM saw a sail heading to the southward at daylight took in the fore sail & close reefed the main & fore sail last part fresh gales from the N.W. and W.S.W. with rain at 10 PM kept the ship N.W.W. at 11 PM huffed to the wind on the starboard tack up W.W.W. with strong gales & rugged ocean

Saturday March 18th

Commences with fresh gales from W.S.W. heading to the N.W. at 2 PM set the fore sail & fore top sail & kept her away N.W.W. middle part strong breezes from the W.S.W. and squally steering N.W.W. turned the reef out & set the main & fore top sail last part light breezes from the S.W. steering N.W.W. all drawing sail set the watch employed in taking up spare spars and sandry jobs occurs

Sunday March 19th

Commences with light air from S.W. steering North all hands employed in taking up spare spars & various jobs middle part light breezes from the southward and fine weather steering N.W. all drawing sail set last part moderate breezes from S.E. & fine weather steering N.W.E. all sail set at 10 PM saw the Island of Mocha bearing N.E. by E. 41 miles distant occurs
