

Thursday March 28th 1854

Commences with strong breezes from the northward
and thick rainy weather one watch ashore on Liberty
middle part strong breezes from the northward & rainy
last part light breezes from the northward employed
in getting off wood one watch ashore on Liberty occurs

Friday March 29th

Commences with moderate breezes from the southward
& foggy weather employed about various jobs
middle part moderate breezes from the northward
last part strong breezes from the northward & thick
rainy weather one watch ashore on Liberty occurs

Saturday April 1st 1854

Commences with fresh gales from the northward
and thick rainy weather at 5 o'clock P.M. let go the
carboard anchor at 8 o'clock wind from the southward
middle part fresh breezes from the southward
last part moderate breezes from the southward
employed in loading off potatoes & various jobs occurs

Sunday April 2nd

Commences with moderate breezes from the southward
middle part light airs & calm
last part the same employed about various jobs
George Turner deserted occurs

Monday April 3rd

Commences with light breezes from the southward
middle part calm
last part strong breezes from the northward & rainy
at 11 o'clock caught Turner & brought him aboard occurs

Tuesday April 4th 1854

Commences with fresh breezes from the northward & rainy
middle part fresh breezes from the northward & rainy
last part moderate breezes from the northward & thick weather

Wednesday April 5th

Commences with light airs from the northward
middle part calm & thick weather
last part light breezes from the northward occurs

Thursday April 6th

Commences with light breezes from the northward
middle part calm with some rain
last part light airs from the northward occurs

Friday April 7th

Commences with light breezes from the northward
at 5 o'clock P.M. took the anchor and dished out
middle part calm, laying at anchor
last part light airs from the southward at 8 o'clock went on shore
and took eight men out of prison & brought them on board
at 11 o'clock A.M. got under weigh & stood out of the bay occurs

Saturday April 8th

Commences with light airs from the northward heading out
of the bay employed in towing the anchors & various jobs
middle part light breezes from the southward steering
N.W. Wall sail set two sails in sight
last part fresh breezes from the southward & fine weather
steering N.W. Wall employed about various jobs of ship's duty
and ship's backs a sail in sight occurs
