

Monday April 17th 1854

Commences with light breezes from the S. S. E. employed about the whole at sunset made sail middle part light airs heading to the S. S. E.

Lat 28-22 at 11oc PM started the fires & commenced boiling
Lon 75-50 last part light airs and calms employed in boiling occurs

Tuesday April 18th

Commences with light airs from the southward heading to the eastward employed in boiling middle part calm employed in boiling

Lat 28-20 last part light airs & calm employed in boiling
Lon 75-50 and various jobs of duty occur

Wednesday April 19th

Commences with light breezes from the southward heading by the wind to the W. S. W. employed in boiling middle part moderate breezes from the southward at 3oc AM finished boiling and cooled down

Lat 28-26 last part moderate breezes from the S. S. E. and fine
Lon 77-45 weather steering W. S. W. employed about various jobs occur

Thursday April 20th

Commences with moderate breezes from the S. S. E. steering W. S. W. employed about various jobs of ship's duty at sunset wore ship to the eastward

Lat 28-11 middle part moderate breezes & fine weather heading E. S. E.
Lon 76-10 last part moderate breezes from the S. S. E. heading to the E. S. E. employed in cutting up stores & various jobs occur

Friday April 21st

Commences with moderate breezes from the S. S. E. heading to the E. N. E. employed about various jobs of ship's duty at 6oc PM spoke ship Balena of New Bedford 7oc out 7 1/2 M

Lat 28-17 middle part moderate breezes & fine weather heading E. S. E.
last part moderate breezes from S. S. E. heading S. W. over

Saturday April 22nd 1854

Commences with moderate trade winds from the S. S. E. heading to the S. W. employed about various jobs of ship's duty the ship Balena of New Bedford in sight

Lat 28-06 middle part moderate breezes from the S. S. E. & fine weather
Lon 75-50 last part moderate trades from the S. E. heading to the E. N. E. employed in coopers oil the ship Balena in sight occurs

Sunday April 23rd

Commences with fresh trades from the S. E. heading to the E. N. E. at 4oc PM spoke ship Balena of New Bedford middle part fresh trades from the S. S. E. heading to the S. W.

Lat 28-06 at daylight wore ship to the eastward & made sail
Lon 75-50 last part fresh trades from the S. S. E. heading East occurs

Monday April 24th

Commences with fresh trade winds from the southward heading by the wind to the eastward at sunset double reefed the top sails took in fore & main sails jib & spanker & wore ship to the S. W. middle part strong breezes and squally heading to the S. W.

Lat 28-53 last part - fresh breezes from the S. S. E. and squally
Lon 75-50 steering N. N. E. under double reefed top sails & fore sail worn

Tuesday April 25th

Commences with strong trade winds from S. S. E. and squally steering N. N. E. under double reefed top sails and fore sail & jib at sunset huffed to the wind up East & took in the jib middle part fresh breezes and rugged heading E. N. E.

Lat 28-55 last part fresh trade winds from S. S. E. and rugged steering N. N. E. under double reefed top sails and fore sail employed about various jobs occur
