Commenced with fresh trade winds from S. S. E. and
rugged steering N. W. E. under double reefed top-sails
and fore sail at sunset were ship to the S. W. & took in the fore sail
middle part fresh breezes from the S. S. E. heading to the S. W.
last part fresh breezes and rugged employed in heaving
Lat 21-37 out and stowing down oil in the main hold covent

Thursday April 27th

Commenced with fresh breezes from the S. S. E. and rugged
employed in stowing down oil in the main hold
middle part fresh breezes from the S. S. E. and rugged
last part strong breezes from S. S. E. and rugged steering
N. W. W. under double reefed top-sails & fore sail employed
in stowing off the main hold covent No Observations

Friday April 28th

Commenced with strong breezes from the S. S. E. and cloudy
weather steering from N. W. W. to N. E. employed in stowing
off the main hold at 2 P. M. finished & washed of the decks
at sunset luffed to the wind up E. N. E. under double reefed
top-sails and fore sail furled the jib
middle part fresh breezes and cloudy heading E. N. E.
Lat 21-06 last part moderate breezes from the S. S. E. heading to
Lon 74-51 the E. N. E. under top-sails & courses covent

Saturday April 29th

Commenced with moderate breezes from the S. S. E.
heading by the wind up E. N. E. under top-sails & courses
middle part moderate breezes from the S. S. E.
last part moderate breezes from the S. S. E. and
Lat 20-41 cloudy weather heading by the wind on the starboard
Lon 73-03 tack up E. N. E. under top-sails & courses covent

Sunday April 30th 1854

Commenced with moderate breezes from the S. S. E. and cloudy
weather heading by the wind on the starboard tack up E. N. E.
at sunset took in main sail jib and spanker
middle part moderate breezes from the S. S. E. at midnight
were ship to the S. W. at 3 P. M. were again to the eastward
Lat 20-19 last part light breezes from the S. E. and fine weather
Lon 71-51 saw black fish lowered for them with out success covent

Monday May 1st 1854

Commenced with moderate breezes from the S. E. and
fine weather heading E. N. E. all sail out at sunset
took in the light sails main sail jib and spanker
middle part laying with the main top sail which at daylight
braced full and made sail heading up E. N. E.
last part employed in heaving out for sails sent the
Lat 20-03 old fore & main top-sails fore sail main sail & spanker
Lon 70-58 steering N. E. the land in sight covent

Tuesday May 2^d

Commenced with moderate breezes from the S. S. E. steering
N. W. employed in bending sail & various jibs at sunset
were ship to the S. W. with the main top-sail aback
middle part light breezes & fine weather laying aback
at daylight kept her away with W. wind made sail
Lat 19-29 last part light trade steering N. W. W. big in sight to the
eastward covent

Wednesday May 3^d

Commenced with light trade winds from the S. S. E.
steering W. N. W. big in sight at sunset luffed to the
wind up S. W. and took in main top gallant sail & main sail
middle part moderate breezes & fine weather
last part moderate trades from the S. S. E. steering
Lat 19-26 West a sail in sight to the Eastward covent
Lon 73-00 employed in painting the starboard boat covent
