Commences with light trade winds from the southwest steering W.N.W. saw Schockfish at 4 or P.M. kept her West at sunset took in the main top gallant sails middle part moderate trades steering West last part fresh trades & fine weather steering West the watch employed about various jobs occur

Tuesday June 5th

Commences with moderate trade winds from S.E. and squally at 5 or P.M. saw a sail to the seaward at sunset took in the light sails heading up S.W. middle part moderate breezes from the S.W. last part part moderate trades from S.E. heading to the E.N.E. a sail in sight at 10 or were ship to the N.W. at 11 or spoke ship Potomac of Nantucket 9 miles at 12 or over

Commences with moderate trades from S.E. & heading S.W. in company with ship Potomac middle part light breezes heading to the S.S.W. last part light trades steering from W.S. to W. the Potomac in sight the watch employed about various jobs

Commences with light trades from the S.E. & fine weather at 4 or P.M. spoke ship Potomac of Nantucket middle part light breezes & fine weather heading E.N.E. last part light trade winds & fine weather steering West the Potomac in sight saw finbacks the watch employed about various jobs occur

Friday June 8th 1854

Commences with moderate trade winds from S.E. steering N. at 4 or P.M. spoke ship Potomac of Nantucket middle part laying aback heading to the E.N.E. at daylight kept her West last part moderate trades steering N.W. the Potomac in sight the watch employed about various jobs occur

Saturday June 9th

Commences with moderate trade winds from the S.E. and fine weather steering N.W. the ship Potomac of Nantucket in sight at sunset took in the light sails and luffed to the wind with the main top sail aback heading E.N.E. middle part light trades & fine weather laying aback last part light trade winds steering N.W. the Potomac in sight at 10 or P.M. saw Woods Island bearing N.W. 48 miles the watch employed about various jobs occur

Lat 1-56

Sunday June 10th

Commences with moderate trade winds steering N.W. to N. Woods Island bearing N.W. 20 miles distant at sunset spoke ship Potomac & luffed to the wind up E.N.E. middle part laying aback heading to the E.N.E. last part light trades from S.E. steering North the ship Potomac in sight Chatham Island bearing N.W. 20 miles distant occur

Lat 1-11

Monday June 11th

Commences with light breezes from S.E. & fine weather steering N.W. E. handy in with Chatham Island in company with the ship Potomac of Nantucket middle part light trades & fine weather laying aback last part moderate trades steering N.W. E. handy in with Chatham Island the Potomac & a bark in sight occur
