

Tuesday June 15th 1854

Commenced with moderate trades at 10 P.M. sent a boat on shore at Chatham Island for ketchup at 2 o'clock Bark Catharwood of Westport 9 m out 1st at 5 o'clock P.M. the boat came on board with out success at sunset spoke the Potomac middle part moderate trades working the Bark to windward last part moderate trades at 8 o'clock A.M. the boat went on shore at Chatham Island for ketchup & crew

Wednesday June 14th

Commenced with moderate trades from the S.E. laying off & on at Chatham Island in company with ship Potomac of Nantucket at 8 o'clock P.M. the boat came off from the shore with ketchup & crew middle part moderate trades heading to the Eastward last part fresh trade winds from the S.E. heading to the Eastward the ship Potomac in sight to the windward and a bark to the leeward scene

Thursday June 15th

Commenced with moderate trade winds from the S.E. heading to the eastward the Potomac & a bark in sight at sunset tacked ship to the S.W. & took in the light sails middle part moderate trades heading to the W.S.W. last part moderate trades & fine weather heading by the wind to the W.S.W. the Potomac in sight Chatham Island bearing N.W. 31 miles distant scene

Friday June 16th

Commenced with moderate-trade winds from S.E. heading to the W.S.W. Chatham & Floods Islands in sight the ship Potomac of Nantucket in sight to the leeward at sunset tacked ship to the E. & Charles Islands bearing N. 40 miles in Floods S. 15 miles in last part fresh trades steering from W. to W.S.W. Floods & Charles Islands in sight scene

Lat 1-22

Saturday June 17th 1854

Commenced with moderate trade winds steering N.W. & handy in with Charles Island at 4 o'clock P.M. spoke ship Potomac of Nantucket at Sunset Charles Island bore S. 15 miles in middle part light airs heading to the westward last part light airs & calms heading to the W.S.W. handy in with the south part of Abbeemarle Island the Potomac in sight scene

Lat 1-10

Sunday June 18th

Commenced with moderate breezes from S.E. steering from W. N. to W.W. at sunset duffed to the wind & took in the light sails handy in with the land the Potomac in sight middle part laying aback off sixth head of Abbeemarle last part light trades steering N.W. handy in with the land scene

Lat 10-82
Lon 92-00

Monday June 19th

Commenced with fresh trades & fine weather off the North Head of Abbeemarle at 4 o'clock P.M. spoke ship Memnon of Nantucket & bark Andrews of New Bedford at 10 o'clock bark Swan of New Bedford middle part moderate trades heading to the eastward last part fresh trades & fine weather heading off & in to lee bay with five sails in sight scene

Lat 19-57

Tuesday June 20th

Commenced with fresh trades heading off & in to lee bay at 8 o'clock P.M. spoke ship Potomac & Memnon of Nantucket middle part laying aback at daylight kept the N.W. & last part fresh trade winds & fine weather steering from N.W. & E. to W.E. one sail in sight the watch employed about various jobs of ship's duty scene off Rodonde Rock
