

Friday June 28th 1854

Commenced with moderate trade winds from the southward employed in boiling at 10 P.M. tacked ship to the E.S.E. at 2 P.M. finished boiling & washed off the decks middle part light airs heading to the south & West last part light airs & calms two sails in sight to the leeward Redoubt Rock bearing E.S.E. 15 miles distant (see end)

Saturday July 1st 1854

Commenced with light airs heading E.S.E. with four sails in sight at sunset took in the main sail middle part laying aback off North Head last part fresh trades employed in stowing down oil in the main hold at 8 A.M. spoke Bark Eugena of New Bedford at noon finished stowing down some three sails in sight

Sunday July 2^d

Commenced with fresh trades cruising off Abbeville at 3 P.M. spoke ship Potomac of Nantucket & Bark Sea Queen of Westport & Eugena of New Bedford middle part laying aback at daylight kept her N.W. last part fresh breezes three sails in sight at 10 P.M. spoke Bark Sea Fox of Westport & Eugena of New Bedford (see end)

Monday July 3^d

Commenced with fresh breezes steering N.N.E. in company with the Sea Fox & Eugena at sunset shifted to the wind up S.W. middle part laying aback at day light braced full heading East last part light airs & calms heading to the Eastward with two sails in sight at 10 A.M. wore ship to the N.W. employed in repairing the fly jib (see end)

Tuesday July 4th 1854

Commenced with moderate trades heading to the W.S.W. at 3 P.M. spoke Barks Sea Fox & Sea Queen of Westport middle part fresh trades laying aback heading to the W.S.W. last part fresh trades steering N.N.W. the Sea Fox & Sea Queen in sight employed in getting a new boat (see end)

Wednesday July 5th

Commenced with fresh breezes & fine weather steering West in company with the Sea Queen of Westport middle part moderate trades laying aback at midnight kept her away North the Sea Queen in sight last part moderate trades & cloudy weather steering N.N.E. the watch employed about various jobs (see end)

Thursday July 6th

Commenced with moderate trades from S.E. heading by the wind to the E.N.E. the Bark Sea Queen in sight at 2 P.M. saw Cullipers Island bearing east 20 miles distant a sail in sight to the leeward at sunset tacked ship to the N.S.W. middle part fresh breezes took in the light sails at 8 P.M. tacked ship to the eastward with thick weather last part strong breezes & rugged with thick rainy weather heading to the eastward a sail in sight to windward at noon tacked ship to the S.W. (see end)

Friday July 7th

Commenced with fresh trades & rugged heading to the S.W. at sunset tacked ship to the eastward a sail in sight to windward at 2 P.M. spoke Bark Sea Fox of Westport middle part fresh breezes & rugged heading to the eastward last part strong trades and rugged heading to the S.W. in company with the Sea Fox a sail in sight to the windward (see end)
