

Saturday July 8th 1854

Commenced with strong trade winds from S.E. and rigged heading to the N.E. W. in company with the Sea Fox. at 4 P.M. spoke Bark Morning Star of New Bedford 8 mi out 1700 lbs fine middle part strong trades and rigged heading to the E.N.E. last part fresh trades heading to the eastward the watch employed about various jobs at 9 P.M. passed Bark Sea Fox
Lat 48-48 steering N.E. ocean

Sunday July 9th

Commenced with moderate trade winds heading E.N.E. at sunset took the light sails & main sail heading East middle part moderate trades heading to the eastward last part light trades & fine weather steering N.E. & the Island of Abemarle in sight bearing S.E. 40 miles distant
Lat 50-56 Wenmans Island bearing N.E. 27 miles distant ocean

Monday July 10th

Commenced with light trades from S.E. steering from N.E. to N.E. at sunset luffed to the wind up E.S.E. Wenmans Island bearing N.E. 12 miles distant with two sails in sight middle part light trades heading to the eastward last part moderate trades heading to the eastward off Wenmans Island a sail in sight to windward ocean

Tuesday July 11th

Commenced with moderate trades heading to the eastward at 1 P.M. spoke Bark Sea Queen of Westport and steered N.W. at sunset wore ship to the eastward Culpers Island bearing N.W. middle part moderate trades heading to the eastward last part fresh trades and fine weather heading to the S.W. handy in with Culpers Island with two sails in sight

Wednesday July 12th 1854

Commenced with moderate trades from the S.E. heading to the S.W. at 2 P.M. spoke Bark Carolina of New Bedford & Bark Sea Queen of Westport at 4 P.M. spoke Bark Morning Star of New Bedford middle part moderate trades heading to the Eastward at daylight wore ship to the S.W. sail in sight to windward last part fresh trades & thick rainy weather heading to the S.W. Culpers Island in sight to windward ocean

Thursday July 13th

Commenced with fresh trades from S.E. and equally heading to the S.W. at sunset wore ship to the Eastward middle part moderate trades & thick weather heading to the Eastward at daylight wore ship to the S.E. with thick weather last part moderate trades & thick equally weather at 7 P.M. wore ship to the eastward the watch employed about various jobs

Friday July 14th

Commenced with moderate trade winds from the S.E. and thick equally weather heading by the wind to the E.N.E. with two sails in sight at sunset Culpers Island bore E.S. 30 miles distant middle part moderate trades and clear weather heading E.N.E. last part fresh trades & fine weather heading by the wind to the eastward a sail in sight to windward ocean
Lat 52-05

Saturday July 15th

Commenced with moderate trade winds from S.E. heading by the wind to the eastward Culpers in sight bearing S.E. at sunset tacked ship to the S.W. with fine weather middle part light trades at 8 P.M. wore ship to the E.S.E. at 11 were again to the S.W. at 2 P.M. wore again to the E.S.E. last part moderate trades & fine weather at 8 P.M. wore ship to the S.W. employed about various jobs
