

Sunday July 16th 1854

Commences with moderate trade winds from S. S. E. and fine weather heading by the wind to the S. W. at 4 o'clock were ship to the E. S. E. Culpeper Island bearing S. 30 miles distant a sail in sight to windward at sunset set the fore top gallant sail middle part light trades heading to the E. S. E. last part light air heading to the eastward a sail in sight to the windward ocean.

Monday July 17th

Commences with light trades from S. S. E. heading on the starboard tack to the E. S. E. at 2 o'clock tacked ship to the S. W. at 5 o'clock Bark Morning Star of New Bedford middle part moderate trades heading to the S. W. at daylight tacked ship to the E. S. E. a sail in sight last part fresh trades & thick weather at 8 o'clock tacked ship to the S. W. a sail in sight ahead at 9 o'clock tacked again to the E. S. E. ocean.

Tuesday July 18th

Commences with moderate trade winds from S. S. E. heading to the eastward at 2 o'clock on Culpeper Island bearing S. E. 30 miles distant at sunset tacked ship to the S. W. at 8 o'clock tacked again to the E. S. E. with fresh breezes last part strong trades heading to the E. S. E. took in the light sails Culpeper Island bearing S. E. 15 miles distant ocean.

Wednesday July 19th

Commences with fresh trades from the southward at 2 o'clock a boat went in to Culpeper for fish at 4 o'clock the boat came on board at 5 o'clock Bark Paulina of New Bedford 10 miles out 2 1/2 o'clock middle part light breezes heading to the eastward last part moderate trades & fine weather at 8 o'clock tacked ship to the S. W. the Paulina in sight ocean.

Thursday July 20th 1854

Commences with light trade winds at 1 o'clock were ship to the eastward at sunset were again to the S. W. the Bark Paulina in sight Culpeper bearing E. S. 10 miles distant middle part light air heading to the S. W. at 4 o'clock were ship to the E. S. E. at daylight Culpeper bore E. S. 10 miles distant last part moderate trades & thick weather at 8 o'clock tacked ship to the S. W. at noon tacked again to the E. S. E. employed in getting up the fly jib rigging ocean.

Friday July 21st

Commences with moderate trades from the S. S. E. and thick weather heading up on the starboard tack E. S. E. middle part moderate trades heading to the eastward last part moderate breezes & thick cloudy weather heading by the wind to the E. S. E. employed in heaving out for water & various jobs ocean.

Saturday July 22nd

Commences with moderate trades from the southward heading by the wind on the starboard tack to the E. S. E. middle part light trades heading by the wind to the E. S. E. last part light air at 6 o'clock saw a sperm whale heading to the N. E. quick at 7 o'clock lowered for him & chased till he came on board took up the boat a tack in sight to the seaward with her boat down ocean.

Sunday July 23rd

Commences with light trades from the southward steering North with two sails in sight at 1 o'clock saw more whales lowered & chased till sunset with out success the Bark Paulina and another Bark in sight middle part moderate trades heading to the eastward at midnight were ship to the S. W. at daylight again to E. S. E. last part strong breezes heading to the Eastward ocean.
