

Saturday August 19th 1854

Commenced with light breezes from the westward at 2 o'clock came to anchor at Lumber in 4 fathoms water the Bark Montgomery of New Bedford lying at anchor middle part calm & thick weather last part light breezes from the westward employed in getting off wood coals

Sunday August 20th

Commenced with light breezes employed in getting off wood middle part light breezes and thick weather last part light airs and variable coals

Monday August 21st

Commenced with fresh breezes from S.E. the boat came off with 10 bbls of potatoes & 24 pumpkins middle part light airs and thick weather last part light breezes employed in getting off wood at 10 o'clock the ship Nautilus came in & anchored coals

Tuesday August 22nd

Commenced with moderate breezes & fine weather employed in getting off 25 bbls potatoes & 100 pumpkins & a cargo of water and various goods middle part light breezes & fine weather last part calm employed in getting off potatoes &c

Wednesday August 23rd

Commenced with fresh breezes from from W.S.W. employed about various jobs of port duty middle part calm with thick weather last part light breezes from W.N.W. to N.W. at 6 o'clock A.M. took our anchor and stood off to the westward in company with the Bark Montgomery of New Bedford coals

Thursday August 24th 1854

Commenced with moderate trades from the S.W. employed in working to windward in company with the Bark Montgomery middle part light breezes and variable working to windward last part light airs and calm the Montgomery in sight coals

Friday August 25th

Commenced with fresh trades from S.W. employed in working the ship to windward handy in with the bark the Montgomery in sight at 4 o'clock A.M. took in the light sails middle part strong breezes and rugged heading up by the wind from W.S.W. to S.W. at 2 o'clock A.M. set the light sails last part moderate breezes from the southward at 9 o'clock A.M. lashed ship to the E.S.E. employed about various jobs coals

Saturday August 26th

Commenced with moderate breezes from the southward heading by the wind to the E.S.E. the watch employed about his duty middle part moderate breezes from S.E. working to windward last part light breezes from S.E. heading by the wind to the S.W. the watch employed about various jobs saw blackbird lowered for them with out success coals

Sunday August 27th

Commenced with moderate trades from the southward heading up by the wind on the starboard tack S.E. by E. middle part moderate breezes heading to the southward last part light breezes heading to the eastward the bark in sight saw blackbird coals

Monday August 28th

Commenced with fresh trades heading S.E. by E. at 6 o'clock A.M. came to anchor in Pyta in 8 fathoms water middle and last part light breezes & thick weather employed in painting ship coals
