Commences with moderate trade winds from the S. S. E. heading by the wind to the S. W. at 4 P.M. tacked ship to the E. S. E. middle part fresh trades & cloudy heading to the E. S. E.

W on the starboard tack from S. E. by E to S. E. occurs

Tuesday. October 21st

Commences with fresh trade winds from the southward heading up by the wind on the starboard S. E. by E middle part fresh breezes at 11 A.M. tacked ship to the W. S. W. last part moderate trades from the southward heading to the W. S. W. the N. E. point of Chatham Island bearing N. by W.

the watch employed about sundry jobs occurs

Wednesday November 1st 1854

Commences with moderate trade winds from the southward heading by the wind to the W. S. W. handy in with Chatham Island at sunset Herds Island bore south 20 miles distant middle part moderate breezes off Chatham Island last part fresh trades from the S. S. E. heading to the S. W. employed about various jobs occurs

Thursday November 2nd

Commences with moderate trade winds from the S. E. heading by the wind to the S. W. handy in with Gardner's Island at sunset the middle of Charles Island bore N. W. 6 miles middle part light breezes steering N. by W. at daylight kept her S. W. W. last part light trades & smoky weather steering from N. W. W. to West. Beattie Island bearing E. N. E. 20 miles occurs

Friday. November 3rd 1854

Commences with moderate trade winds from the S. E. steering from N. by N. W. handy in with the south head of Abemarle Island at 4 P.M. saw a large sperm whale going to windward quick lowered for him & pulled to windward till sunset but did not see him again came on board middle part standing off & on at south head at daylight kept her away to the northward with fresh breezes last part fresh breezes & fine weather running to the northward

saw Blackfish the watch employed about various jobs occurs

Saturday November 4th

Commences with fresh trade winds from the S. S. E. & fine weather steering from N. W. by N. handy in with the land at sunset tacked to the wind up N. by E. off Lee Bay middle part standing off & on at Harbours last part light trades & fine weather off Lee Bay saw Blackfish and finbacks occurs
Lat 00-11

Sunday November 5th

Commences with moderate trades & fine weather heading to the E. S. E. at 2 P.M. kept her away to the northward at sunset tacked to the wind up N. by E. handy in with North Head middle part light breezes & pleasant off Lee Bay last part light trades and fine weather off Lee Bay occurs
Lat 00-07

Monday November 6th

Commences with light trades & fine weather cruising off Lee Bay at sunset tacked ship to the westward middle part light breezes & fine weather off Lee Bay last part moderate trades & fine weather employed in repairing sails at 9 A.M. kept her away to the northward occurs off Lee Bay
