

Thursday February 16th 1855

Commences with light breezes from the westward and fine weather steering E.S.E. all drawing sail set a sail in sight astern

middle part moderate breezes from the S.S.W. at midnight the wind hauled to the E.S.E. lashed ship to the southward with cloudy weather

Lat 33-31^S heading up on the starboard tack by the wind
Lon 15-52 from S.S.E. to S.E. by S. soon the mate sick

Friday February 17th

Commences with moderate breezes from the E.N.E. and cloudy weather with a heavy swell from the southward heading by the wind from S.E. to S.E. by E.

Lat 34-57^S middle part light breezes from the N.E. heading from E.S.E. to S.E.
Lon 14-52 last part light breezes from the N.E. heading E.S.E. the watch employed about various jobs of ship's duty a sail in sight to windward soon

Saturday February 18th

Commences with light airs from the N.E. heading on the starboard tack to the E.S.E. all sail set middle part light airs & calms heading to the S.E.

Lat 35-08^S last part light airs from the E.N.E. and calms
Lon 14-24 heading to the S.E. soon the mate sick

Sunday February 19th

Commences with light airs from the E.N.E. heading to the S.E. a sail in sight off the lee quarter middle part light airs & calms heading to the S.E.

Lat 35-53^S last part light airs & calms three sails in sight at 10^h A.M. spoke the English Bark, Cativitos, from the Chincha
Lon 13-44 bound to King'sdome soon

Monday February 20th 1855

Commences with light airs from the N.E. and calms heading to the E.S.E. with three sails in sight

middle part light breezes from the N.W. heading to the eastward at 10^h A.M. the wind hauled to the N.W. & steered E.N.E.

Lat 36-13^S last part fresh breezes from the N.W. & fine weather
Lon 11-54 steering E.N.E. a brig in sight to windward heading N.E. by E. soon

Tuesday February 21st

Commences with fresh breezes from the N.W. and fine weather steering E.N.E. all sail set two sails in sight

middle part light breezes from N.W. steering E.N.E.

Lat 36-05^S last part light breezes from the N.W. and fine weather
Lon 09-25 steering E.N.E. the watch employed in repairing the gibs & various jobs of ship's duty soon

Wednesday February 22nd

Commences with light breezes from N.W. and N.W.W. with fine weather steering E.N.E. the watch employed about sundry jobs of ship's duty

middle part calm heading to the eastward

last part light breezes from the N.E. and the northward heading up by the wind on the starboard tack from E.S.E.

Lat 36-24^S to E.N.E. the watch employed in washing the ship inside soon

Thursday February 23rd

Commences with fresh breezes from the northward heading up by the wind on the starboard tack E.N.E.

middle part moderate breezes heading E.N.E.

last part fresh breezes from the northward

heading up by the wind to the E.N.E. at 8^h A.M.

Lat 36-22^S took in the light sails and took one reef in
Lon 05-55 the fore top sail soon
