

Monday February 26th 1855

Commences with strong breezes from the S. E. and rugged heading by the wind to the S. W. at sunset Juan Fernandez bearing S. 6 miles distant heading S. W. under double reefed top sails & fore sail middle part strong breezes at 8 o'clock wore ship to the eastward last part strong breezes from the S. E. & squally heading in for Juan Fernandez saw a big heading to the S. E. at 11 o'clock the Capt went on shore at Juan the Bark Susan of New Bedford in sight soon

Tuesday February 27th

Commences with fresh breezes from the S. E. laying off & on at Juan Fernandez at 4 o'clock the Capt came on board faced full heading to the S. W. with fresh breezes middle part strong breezes heading to the S. W. last part strong breezes from the S. E. heading up by the wind on the landward tack to the S. W. under double reefed top sails fore sail jib & spanker the Island of

Lat 33-55 passengers in sight bearing N. 30 miles soon

Wednesday February 28th

Commences with strong breezes from the S. E. heading by the wind to the S. W. set the main sail at 4 o'clock wore ship to the eastward passengers bearing N. 20 miles middle part fresh breezes from the S. E. heading to the eastward last part fresh breezes from the southward heading by the wind to the eastward turned the reefs out of the main top sails set the jib & gaff top sail at 9 o'clock tacked ship to the S. W. at 11 o'clock tacked again at 3 o'clock to the eastward the Island of Juan Fernandez bearing N. E. 31 miles the watch employed about various jobs & ends

Thursday March 1st 1855

Commences with moderate breezes from the S. E. & fine weather heading by the wind to the E. S. E. all hands employed in unbending old sails and bending new ones saw a whale ship to the windward heading to the westward at sunset the Island of Juan Fernandez bore N. W. 20 miles middle part strong breezes from the S. E. took in the light sails & double reefed the top sails at 10 o'clock wore ship to the S. W. with strong breezes and squally last part strong breezes from the S. E. & rugged heading to the S. W. at 8 o'clock wore ship to the eastward a sail in sight off the lee bow at noon wore ship to the S. W. Juan bearing N. W. soon

Friday March 2nd

Commences with strong breezes from the S. E. & rugged heading by the wind up S. E. W. under double reefed top sails & courses middle part strong breezes & squally heading to the S. E. W. at daylight wore ship to the eastward with fresh breezes last part more moderate turned the reefs out of the main top sail at 11 o'clock wore ship to the S. W. soon

Saturday March 3rd

Commences with moderate breezes from the S. E. & fine weather heading by the wind to the S. W. at 5 o'clock wore ship to the eastward under top sails & courses middle part moderate breezes from the S. E. & heading to the eastward at 1 o'clock tacked ship to the S. W. last part moderate breezes from the S. E. and fine weather heading by the wind from S. W. by S. to S. E. W. soon

Sunday March 4th

Commences with moderate breezes from the S. E. heading S. E. W. middle part fresh breezes wore ship to the eastward last part strong breezes from the S. E. heading to the eastward under double reefed top sails & courses at noon wore ship to the S. E. W. with squally weather soon
