

Monday March 25th 1855

Commenced with strong breezes from the S.E. & equally heading up by the wind on the starboard tack S.W. by S under double reefed top sails & courses at 10 AM. wore ship to the eastward middle part strong breezes from S.E. & equally heading E. last part fresh breezes from the S.E. & with equally rain
 Lat 24-08 heading by the wind to the eastward under double reefed
 Lon 74-46 top sails & courses the watch employed about various jobs & work

Tuesday March 26th

Commenced with strong breezes from S.E. & and rugged heading by the wind to the eastward saw pinbacks middle part fresh breezes & equally heading east last part moderate breezes from the S.E. & and
 Lat 24-54 fine weather heading up by the wind from E to E.S. & S
 Lon 76-12 turned the reef out of the top sails & set the fly jib & boom

Wednesday March 27th

Commenced with moderate breezes from the S.E. & and fine weather heading up on the starboard tack from East to E.S. & set the main top gallant sail at 5 AM. took in the light sails at sunset double reefed the top sails middle part fresh breezes heading by the wind to the eastward last part moderate breezes from the S.E. & clear
 Lat 25-12 weather turned the reef out and set the top gallant sails
 Lon 74-50 and fly jib heading from E to E.S. & S & work

Thursday March 28th

Commenced with light breezes from the southward and clear weather heading up by the wind to the S.E. & middle part light airs from the S.W. heading S.E. last part light breezes from the W.N.W. steering S.E. & E
 Lat 25-55 saw two sails & the main land the watch employed about sundry jobs of ship's duty & work

Friday March 29th 1855

Commenced with moderate breezes from the N.W. steering from S.E. to S.E. by E. all sail out the land in sight at sunset took in the top gallant sails the land 28 miles distant middle part fresh breezes from N.W. steering N.W. at midnight luffed to the wind with the main top sail aback heading W.N.W. at daylight fresh breezes and thick rainy weather & work

Saturday March 30th

Commenced with fresh breezes from the N.W. & and thick weather at 10 AM. came anchor in Salchahuana in 5 fathoms middle part calm with thick foggy weather last part light airs from the S.E. & employed in port duty & work

Sunday March 31st

Commenced with light breezes from the S.W. & fine weather middle part calm and fine weather last part light breezes from the S.W. & fine weather one watch ashore on liberty & work

Monday March 1st 1856

Commenced with fresh breezes from the southward middle part calm and fine weather last part moderate breezes from the southward and clear weather all hands employed in cooping oil & work

Tuesday March 2nd 1856

Commenced with fresh breezes from the southward and clear weather employed in cooping oil & various jobs middle part fresh breezes from the S.W. & clear weather last part moderate breezes from the southward employed in breaking out cooping and stowing down oil & work
