

Thursday March 25th 1855

Commences with light breezes from the southward middle & last part the same one watch ashore on Liberty William Segue Allen Lewis & Samuel deserted scene

Monday March 26th

Commences with thick weather & light airs and variable middle & last part light airs and rainy weather scene

Tuesday March 27th

Commences with fresh breezes from the S.E. & rainy weather employed in getting off flour & various jobs middle and last part light airs & calm employed in getting off potatoes William, Harding deserted scene

Wednesday March 28th

Commences with light breezes from the S.W. middle & last part the same scene

Thursday March 29th

Commences with light breezes from the southward middle part light breezes from the northward last part fresh breezes from the northward scene

Friday March 30th

Commences with fresh breezes from the northward & thick rainy weather middle part calm with rain last part light breezes from the W.W. & fine weather scene

Saturday March 31st

Commences with light breezes from the S.W. & clear weather middle & last part moderate breezes from the southward at 8 o'clock took our anchor & stood out the Bay to the W.W. scene

Thursday April 1st 1855

Commences with fresh breezes from the southward and clear weather steering W.W. at 4 o'clock double reefed the top sails and furlled the main sail the ship William Patch of Fair Haven in sight middle part strong breezes from the southward & rugged last part strong breezes from the S.E. & rugged steering W.W. at 3³⁰ under double reefed top sails and fore sail the ship William Patch in sight to the leeward scene

Monday April 2nd

Commences with fresh breezes from the S.E. steering W.W. & middle part fresh breezes & rugged steering W.W. last part moderate breezes from the S.E. & fine weather steering W.W. turned the reefs out of the top sail set main at 3³⁰ & fore top gallant sails ship William Patch in sight scene

Tuesday April 3rd

Commences with light breezes from the S.E. & fine weather steering W.W. with two sails in sight at 2 o'clock spoke ship William Patch of Fair Haven at sunset took in the light sail & fore sail middle part fresh breezes from the S.E. steering W.W. last part fresh breezes from the S.E. steering W.W. the ship William Patch at 8 o'clock saw her boats down at 8:30 lowered down our boats at 9 o'clock saw the whales going to the leeward scene in chase

Wednesday April 4th

Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. and fine weather the boats in chase of the whales at 1 o'clock the Larboard boat struck one at 2 o'clock took him alongside employed in getting ready for cutting middle part strong breezes from the S.E. laying by the anchor last part strong breezes from the S.E. & rugged employed in cutting ship William Patch in sight scene
