

Tuesday June 12th 1855

Commences with moderate breezes from the southward heading up by the wind on the larboard tack W. S. W. at 3 o'clock P.M. tacked ship to the E. S. E. saw a sail off the lee bow at 6 o'clock of the Bark Paulina of New Bedford about 6500 tons middle part moderate breezes heading to the S.W. W. at 2-16 last part moderate breezes & fine weather heading to the wind to the E. S. E. the Paulina in sight once

Wednesday June 13th

Commences with light trade winds from the S. E. at 2 o'clock P.M. wore ship to the S.W. the Paulina in company at 4 o'clock P.M. saw the Bark Cape Horn from Dartmouth middle part moderate breezes heading to the S.W. W. at 2-24 last part strong breezes and rugged heading to the wind to the W. S. W. the watch employed about sundry jobs occurs

Thursday June 14th

Commences with strong breezes and rugged heading to the wind up S.W. W. at 5 o'clock P.M. saw a sperm whale off the weather quarter going to leeward quick toward for him with out success at dark came on board middle part fresh breezes heading to the S.W. at 10 o'clock P.M. tacked ship to the E. S. E. with fresh breezes - at 2-24 sperm whales going to leeward quick at 8 o'clock toward for them at 10 o'clock struck one at noon took him alongside occurs

Friday June 15th

Commences with moderate breezes from the S. E. at 1 o'clock P.M. commenced cutting at 4 o'clock all in head full heading to the middle part fresh breezes at midnight wore ship to the eastward at 2 o'clock P.M. commenced boiling last part strong breezes from the S. E. and rugged employed in boiling at 6 o'clock P.M. wore ship to the S.W. at 13-48 occurs

Saturday June 16th 1855

Commences with strong breezes from the S. E. heading up by the wind to the S.W. employed in boiling at 3 o'clock P.M. double reefed the top sails strong breezes & rugged middle part strong breezes from the S. E. heading to the S.W. at daylight finished boiling and made sails - at 1-27 last part fresh breezes & fine weather heading to the wind to the S.W. employed in breaking out for provisions occurs

Sunday June 17th

Commences with moderate breezes from S. E. by S. and fine weather heading to the wind on the larboard tack up S.W. W. middle part light breezes from the S. E. heading up S.W. W. at 2-55 last part light air from the S. E. and calms heading to the S.W. on the larboard tack to the S.W. so ends

Monday June 18th

Commences with light air from the S. E. and fine weather heading on the larboard tack to the S.W. middle part light air and calms heading to the S.W. at 2-48 last part light breezes from the S. E. W. heading to the westward the watch employed about sundry jobs occurs

Tuesday June 19th

Commences with moderate breezes from S. E. W. heading to the wind up W. S. E. at 3 o'clock P.M. saw sperm whales off the weather bow at 4 o'clock toward for them the waist boat went on and struck one at dark took him alongside middle part moderate breezes heading to the eastward with the whale alongside at 6 o'clock P.M. wore ship to the westward and commenced cutting at 8 o'clock all in head full heading to the west south west employed in clearing away the head and various jobs occurs
