

Thursday June 28th 1855

Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. heading to the S.W. employed in cutting at 10⁰⁰ P.M. all in beaced full heading to the S.W. S. Whales in sight to windward going quick at 3⁰⁰ P.M. Toward with out success at six⁰⁰ P.M. started the fires

middle part moderate breezes from the S.E. heading to the S.W. employed in boiling out the whale last part moderate breezes from the S.E. heading to the S.W. employed in boiling at 10⁰⁰ A.M. saw sperm whales off the weather bow going quick to windward

Lat 00-24 at 11⁰⁰ tacked to the eastward at 11³⁰ tacked again to the S.W. for the whales scene
Lon 96-16

Friday June 29th

Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. heading by the wind to the S.W. employed in boiling at 10⁰⁰ P.M. saw whales off the lee bow going to windward toward for them with out success

middle part moderate breezes heading to the southward employed in boiling at 3⁰⁰ P.M. finished boiling at 6⁰⁰ wore ship to the N.E. and made out

Lat 00-15 last part moderate breezes from the S.E. heading by the wind to the E.N.E. so ends
Lon 95-58

Saturday June 30th

Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. steering N.E. at sunset tacked ship to the S.W. by S. middle part moderate breezes heading to the S.W.

Lat 01-23 last part fresh breezes steering from W to W.S.W. at 11⁰⁰ luffed to the wind up S.W. at noon saw breeches off the lee beam scene
Lon 96-30

Monday July 1st 1855

Commences with fresh breezes from the E.S.E. steering W.S.W. for the breeches at 2⁰⁰ P.M. made them out sperm whales going to the S.W. quick at 3⁰⁰ toward for them the waist & Carboard boats struck the Carboard boat got stove and lost her line at sunset took one whale along side middle part moderate breezes from the S.E. heading to eastward by the wind with the whale along side

at midnight wore ship to the S.W. under two top sails Lat 00-45 last part moderate breezes at 6⁰⁰ A.M. commenced cutting Lon 96-58 at 9⁰⁰ all in beaced full heading to the S.W. scene

Tuesday July 2nd

Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. and fine weather heading by the wind to the S.W. employed in boiling and various at sunset wore ship to the E.N.

Lat 00-46 middle part moderate heading by the wind from E. to E.N. employed in boiling at daylight wore ship to the S.W. last part moderate breezes from the S.E. heading to the S.W. employed in boiling scene
Lon 96-44

Wednesday July 3rd

Commences with fresh breezes from the S.E. heading by the wind to the S.W. at 10⁰⁰ P.M. finished boiling and washed off the decks at sunset tacked ship to the eastward

Lat 00-42 middle part fresh breezes from the S.E. at midnight wore ship to the S.W. at daylight wore again to the E.N.E. last part fresh breezes heading to the E.N.E. double reefed the top sails & took in the main sail the watch employed in coopersing oil so ends
Lon 96-30
