

Wednesday July 1855

Commences with fresh trade winds from the S.E. heading by the wind to the E.N.E. the watch employed in cooping oil at sunset wore ship to the S.S.W. middle part moderate breezes heading to the S.W. by S. Last part light breezes from the S.E. heading to the S.W. all hands employed in stowing down oil in the main hold so ends

Thursday July 1855

Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. heading by the wind to the S.W. all hands employed in stowing down oil in the main hold at sunset finished and made sail heading to the S.S.W. middle part moderate breezes heading to the S.S.W. Last part moderate trades from the S.E. at 8 or 11 A.M. tacked ship to the E.N.E. all hands employed in breaking out and stowing down in the fore hold at 11 or 12 A.M. finished and washed off the decks so ends

Friday July 1855

Commences with moderate trade winds from the S.E. and fine weather heading by the wind to the E.N.E. employed in repairing the larboard boat middle part moderate breezes heading to the E.N.E. Last part light breezes from the S.E. & fine weather heading by the wind to the E.N.E. employed in repairing the larboard boat so ends

Saturday July 1855

Commences with light breezes from the S.E. heading to the E.N.E. employed in repairing the larboard boat at 4 or 5 P.M. tacked ship to the S.S.W. with fine weather middle part light breezes heading to the S.S.W. Last part light trades at 7 or 8 A.M. tacked ship to the eastward so ends

Sunday July 1855

Commences with light trade winds from the S.E. and fine weather heading by the wind to the eastward middle part moderate breezes heading to the eastward Last part fresh trades from the S.E. heading up E. by S. at 9 or 10 A.M. took a lunar observation (by Lunar 96.58 arc)

Monday July 1855

Commences with fresh trade winds from the S.E. heading up by the wind on the starboard tack E. by S. middle part moderate breezes heading to the eastward Last part fresh trades & squally at 9 or 10 A.M. tacked ship to the S.S.W. the watch employed about various jobs at noon tacked ship again to the eastward so ends

Tuesday July 1855

Commences with moderate trade winds from the S.E. heading up by the wind on the starboard tack east middle part moderate breezes at 8 or 9 P.M. tacked ship to the S.S.W. with moderate breezes and cloudy weather Last part moderate trades from the S.E. heading to the S.W. at 8 or 9 A.M. put out the larboard boat at noon tacked ship to the eastward so ends

Wednesday July 1855

Commences with moderate trade winds from the S.E. heading up by the wind on the starboard tack E. middle part moderate breezes from the S.E. heading E. Last part strong breezes and rugged heading by the wind to the eastward with thick squally weather so ends
No observations
