

Thursday July 12th 1855

Lat 1-47
Lon 13-36
Commences with strong trade winds from the S. S. E. and rugged heading up by the wind from E. to E. S. E. middle part strong breezes & rugged heading to the E. S. E. last part fresh breezes with clear weather & rugged heading up by the wind on the starboard tack E. S. E. so ends

Friday July 13th

Lat 1-34
Lon 12-58
Commences with fresh trade winds from the southward heading up by the wind on the starboard tack E. S. E. middle part fresh breezes & rugged heading to the E. S. E. last part strong breezes from the southward heading to the E. S. E. at 6 or 7 A.M. took in the light at 8 or double reefed the top sails employed in breaking out for head & floor at 11 or 12 A.M. saw Cullpeppers Island bearing E. by N. 31 miles distant so ends

Saturday July 14th

Commences with moderate trade winds from the southward heading to the E. S. E. Cullpeppers & Wenmans Islands in sight at 8 or 9 P.M. saw two sails off the lee bow middle part light breezes heading to the eastward last part light breezes with squalls of rain Wenmans Island and two sails in sight at 7 or 8 A.M. tacked ship to the westward with thick weather so ends

Sunday July 15th

Lat 1-07
Lon 11-07
Commences with light breezes and thick rainey weather went in shore with a boat for fish at 2 or 3 P.M. came on board & took up the boat heading to the E. N. E. at 7 or 8 P.M. spoke Bark. Paulina of New Bedford last part moderate breezes & fine weather heading to the S. W. Wenmans Island in sight bearing W. N. W. 20 miles distant three sails in sight so ends

Monday July 16th 1855

Commences with moderate breezes from the S. S. E. three sails in sight at 3 or 4 P.M. spoke Bark. Atlantic and Harvest of New Bedford two more sails in sight middle part light breezes heading by the wind to the S. W. last part moderate trades three sails in sight at 6 or 7 A.M. saw a ship with her boats down for whales at 7 or saw whales going to windward did not follow for them so ends

Tuesday July 17th

Lat 10-01
Commences with moderate breezes from the southward three sails in sight at sunset Rodonds Rock bore E. S. E. 8 miles middle part strong breezes working the Bark to windward last part strong breezes & rugged off the north head of Aldermar Island with four sails in sight so ends

Wednesday July 18th

Lat 10-07
Lon 93-15
Commences with strong trade winds from the southward heading to the W. S. W. three sails in sight at 2 or 3 P.M. saw ship to the E. S. E. at 8 or spoke the Bark. Harvest of New Bedford middle part strong breezes & rugged at 9 or 10 P.M. double reefed the top sails & furled the main sail steering W. S. E. last part moderate breezes & thick weather turned the reef out of the main top sail & set the main top gallant sail steering W. S. E. the watch employed about various points so ends

Thursday July 19th

Lat 10-37
Lon 94-30
Commences with light breezes from the S. S. E. steering W. S. E. at sunset tacked to the wind up S. W. took in the top gallant sail double reefed the main top sail & laid it aback middle part light breezes laying aback heading to the S. W. last part light breezes from the S. S. E. steering W. S. E. employed in repairing the main top gallant sail at noon finished and bent it so ends
