

Wednesday August 22^d 1855

Commences with moderate trades from the S.W. heading up by the wind on the starboard tack S.E. saw three vessels laying at anchor at Seamus a sail in sight to windward at 6 or P.M. tacked ship to the W.N.W. handy in with the land at 8 or signalled a bark showing a signal thus [symbol] middle part moderate breezes heading from W. to W.S.W. last part fresh trades heading up by the wind W.S.W. with three sails in sight to windward but could not make them out anything so ends

Thursday August 23^d

Commences with fresh trade winds from the southward two sails in sight at 1 or P.M. tacked ship to the S.E. at 3 or passed a bark heading W.S.W. at sunset tacked ship to the westward middle part moderate breezes heading W. by S. last part fresh trades from the southward heading to the wind to the W.S.W. two sails in sight so ends

Friday August 24th

Commences with moderate trade winds from the southward & fine weather heading up by the wind W.S.W. two sails in sight at 3 or P.M. tacked ship to the E.S.E. middle part moderate breezes at 11 or P.M. spoke bark Joshua Bragdon of New Bedford 22 tons out 700 sperm last part fresh breezes steering from W. to W.N.W. four sails in sight so ends

Saturday August 25th

Commences with light breezes steering W.N.W. at 6 or A.M. spoke bark Superior of New Bedford 27 tons 900 middle part moderate breezes heading to the E.S.E. last part fresh breezes heading to the E.S.E. four sails in sight at 11 or A.M. spoke ship William Roatch of Liverpool so ends

Thursday August 26th 1855

Commences with moderate trades from the southward heading to the E.S.E. in company with the William Roatch middle part moderate breezes heading to the westward last part moderate trades & fine weather heading to the W.S.W. with three sails in sight so ends

Monday August 27th

Commences with moderate trade winds from the southward at 1 or P.M. tacked ship to the E.S.E. at 3 or P.M. ship William Roatch at 5 or spoke bark Joshua Bragdon of New Bedford middle part moderate breezes heading to the W.S.W. last part fresh breezes & thick weather heading by the wind to the E.S.E. a sail in sight to the leeward so ends

Tuesday August 28th

Commences with fresh trade winds from the southward and thick cloudy weather heading by the wind to the E.S.E. at sunset tacked ship to the W.S.W. middle part moderate breezes & thick weather heading to the W.S.W. at midnight tacked ship to the E.S.E. last part fresh trades from the southward at 9 or A.M. tacked ship to the W.S.W. a sail in sight off the weather quarter at 10 or exchanged signals with ship Mary of Whitby so ends

Wednesday August 29th

Commenced with fresh trade winds from the southward heading to the W.S.W. at 4 or P.M. tacked ship to the E.S.E. a sail in sight off the lee beam middle part moderate breezes heading to the E.S.E. last part moderate trades from the southward heading by the wind to the E.S.E. at 7 or A.M. tacked ship to the W.S.W. a sail in sight to the leeward so ends
