

Thursday, August 30th 1855

Commences with moderate trade winds from the southward heading by the wind to the N.S.W. at 3 or P.M. tacked ship to the E.S.E. middle part moderate breezes heading to the E.S.E. last part moderate breezes heading to the E.S.E. four sails in sight at 9 or A.M. spoke ship Northern Empire of Bath 35 days from San Francisco bound to Callao so ends

Friday August 31st

Commences with moderate trades from the S.E.W. heading to the S.E. at 3 or P.M. spoke Bark Paulina of W. Peap middle part moderate breezes heading to the S.E. at daylight tacked ship to the westward handy in with the land a brig in sight to the leeward our humblacks on

Saturday, September 1st 1855

Commences with moderate trade winds from the S.S.W. heading by the wind to the westward at 3 or P.M. tacked ship to the S.E. three sails in sight at 8 or P.M. tacked again to the W. by S middle part moderate breezes heading to the W.S.W. at 11 or P.M. tacked ship to the E.S.E. last part moderate trades & fine weather heading by the wind to the E.S.E. three sails in sight so ends

Sunday September 2nd

Commences with moderate trade winds from the southward heading by the wind to the E.S.E. the land in sight at sunset the Island de la Plata bore S.E. by S. 15 miles three sails in sight middle part moderate breezes working to windward last part moderate breezes heading to the S.E. handy in with the land at noon tacked ship to the westward so ends

Monday September 3rd 1855

Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E.W. at 1 or P.M. the Captain went on board of the Bark Mrs. Jennings of Wilmington, D. laying at anchor in Selang middle part moderate breezes working to windward last part light breezes from the S.S.W. at 1 or A.M. tacked ship to the westward the watch employed in setting up shock cabs. at noon tacked ship to the S.E. the land in sight so ends

Tuesday September 4th

Commences with moderate breezes from the S.S.W. heading up by the wind on the starboard tack to the S.E. a small brig in sight to the windward saw a steamer bound south a sunset tacked ship to the W.S.W. middle part light breezes at 8 or A.M. tacked ship to the S.E. last part light airs & fine weather heading to the S.E. at 1 or A.M. tacked to the westward 2 sails in sight at 10 or tacked again to the S.E. the land in sight so ends

Wednesday September 5th

Commences with light airs from the S.S.W. heading by the wind to the S.E. employed in fitting cables for water at sunset Point St. Helena bore S.E. by E. 5 miles middle part light breezes & cloudy working to windward last part light airs heading to the S.E. handy in with the land two sails in sight so ends

Thursday September 6th

Commences with moderate breezes from the S.W. heading up by the wind S.S.E. at 5 or P.M. spoke Bark Chas. Francis of Warren R.I. the land in sight middle part moderate breezes working to windward last part light breezes from the S.W. heading to the S.E. St. Clara Island bearing E. 6 miles so ends
