Lat 01.01 Begins with a moderate trade steering West Employed stowing away things in the Fore Hold at 4 pm finished and washed off at 6 pm made sail & stowed West Middle Part had brisk breeze Latter Part the same

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Saturday Oct 27

Lat 01.23 Begins with moderate weather steering W by W under all sail Middle Part had strong trades Latter Part much the same so End these 24 hours.

Sunday Oct 28

Lat 02.36 Begins with a brisk trade from S S E steering S W by W under all sail Middle Part had strong breeze steering S W Latter Part much the same

Monday Oct 29

Lat 03.08 Begins with a strong trade and smoky weather steering S W by W under all sail Middle Part had strong trades and passing squalls of rain Latter Part the same

Tuesday Oct 30

Lat 04.36 Begins with a strong trade from S S E steering W by W under all sail Middle Part and Latter Part much the same all hands employed breaking out main hatchway after from hogs

Wednesday Nov 1 1853

Lat 05.41 Begins with a strong trade from steering S W by W Middle Part had strong trades Latter Part much the same so End

Long 132.22

Thursday Nov 2<sup>d</sup> 1853

Lat 07.00 Begins with a strong trade from S S E steering S W by W under all sail Middle Part much the same Latter Part more moderate to day saw Blackfish & porpoises

Friday Nov 3<sup>d</sup>

Lat 08.06 Begins with a brisk trade from steering S W by W under all sail Middle Part had strong trades Latter Part much the same saw porpoises

Saturday Nov 4

Lat 08.18 Begins with a strong trade steering S W by W near sundown saw sperm whale again to windward lowered the boats but did not get near them at sundown Latter Part came on board and doubled reefed the topsails steered by the wind by up N N E untill 3 P M then kept off made sail and steered S W by W Latter Part saw many birds so End these 24 hours

Long 136.45

Sunday Nov 5

Lat 08.55 Begins with a strong trade steering S W by W the breeze inclining to moderate at 5 pm saw one of the manureas islands at 7 pm haced the yards and steered more to the Westwards afterwards kept off again Latter Part saw three whales at 9 P M steering for the Island of Noulakia which with in four or five miles of the Island saw a large sperm whale lowered the boats and struck him the first boat the whale stranded and took her time before the other boat could get to her assistance at noon of chasing the struck so Ends winds light and fine weather
