

Thursday Nov 22 1855
Begins with a strong breeze from
N. by E. at sundown the returned
the Captain little or no better took up the
boat and stood off until 1 PM
then stood in at 8 PM sent the boat in
and met the Pilot coming out to take
the ship in at noon beating up the
Bay with light air and rain squalls

Friday Nov 23
Begins with squally weather and light
air out of the bay after tacking wearing
the fifteen times came to anchor in 25
fathoms of water well out of the Bay
at 4 PM furlled the sails took the Pilot
and went on shore found the Captain
no better the French Dict pronounced the
it to be the Nourality Middle Port
moderate and clear latter Part
had baffling winds and squally at 10 AM
took our anchor and commenced
working up the Bay so Ends today

Saturday Nov 24
Begins with a baffling wind and squally
beating up the bay winds no where in particular
however at 4 PM came to anchor in 7
fathoms of water so Ends the day

Sunday Nov 25
had fine weather the sea
very powerful to day most of
the men on shore on Liberty
the Capt a little better

Monday Nov 26 1855
Begins with a gentle breeze in
the bay one watch on Liberty
the Captain much better

Tuesday Nov 27
had fair weather through out the
day one watch on Liberty and
the much better so Ends with the
Captain once more on board again

Wednesday Nov 28
had strong breeze out of the Bay
all of the fore noon one watch on
Liberty at 10 AM the Captain
went on shore for a short time

Thursday Nov 29
had fine weather with a gentle
breeze out of the Bay to day we
bath get ready for sea latter Part
09:06 took our anchor and went to sea
with a gentle breeze out of the
Bay so Ends steering S.W.

Friday Nov 30
Begins with a light air from the
South East steering S.W. Middle
Part the same latter Part had fine
weather saw a school of sperm whales
leaved and took three of them
two in the waist and one in the tail

Saturday Dec 1 1855
Begins with fine weather and a gentle
breeze Employed in cutting in at 4 PM
09:46 finished and left off West Employed in
clearing away the stores Middle Part
moderate at 4 PM commenced sailing latter
fine weather steering N.W. and boiling so Ends
