

Bound to the Northward

Thursday Mar 26th

Commenced with strong breezes from E with thick and drizzly weather Ship under double reefs at 5 P.M. Blowing a moderate Gale Ship heading to the Northward

Friday Mar 27th

Commenced with a moderate Gale from the Eastward took in Mast Boat and Lashed her up. Masted more moderate at whole Main Top Sail latter more moderate made all sail

Saturday Mar 28th

Commenced with strong breezes from SE Ship under all sail Bound to Valparaiso to Repair Damages Masted and latter the same on Ships deck, most of this day foggy. Lat. 48. 15 S

Sunday Mar 29th

Commenced with moderate breezes from SE Headed to the NE with Squally weather fitted the Pennants, &c. Masted and latter strong strong NE under all sail Employed in the Rigging Lat. 40. 2. S.

Monday Mar 30th

Commenced with moderate breezes from E & SE strong NE under all sail Masted and latter the same. so ends the Sabbath, Lat. 39. 0. S. Long. 24. 1/2.

Monday Mar 31st 1854.

Commenced light from SE strong NE & E under all sail Masted, very light air. latter light and Baffling Employed in Raising Boat

Tuesday Apr 1st

Commenced with light breezes from SE. to SE strong NE & E at 5 A.M. turned SE & saw a Ship supposed to be a Merchantman Bound to the Eastward Masted and latter light and Baffling Lat.

Wednesday Apr 2nd

Commenced light from SE strong NE & E at 6 P.M. turned NE & E Masted light at 9 A.M. turned NE at 1 P.M. saw the Coast of Chile at midday turned NE & E under all sail Lat. 37. 32. S.

Thursday Apr 3rd

Commenced calm masted some light air from SE Employed in Repairing Boat, &c. Masted light at 3 A.M. opened the Passage and stood in at 5 A.M. let go anchor in P.M. then, of water at 1 A.M. Horn up and got under weigh and beat up to End.
