Sunday June 24

This day still a calm started the works and cut in two of the whales. Middle part still boiling. latter part cleared away the two heads and cut in the other whale and sent down the cutting gear.

Monday June 25

This day comes in with a light breeze from the N.W. still boiling and cutting blubber and broke out water. Middle part still boiling. latter part good weather still boiling and cutting blubber and put some oil down below.

Tuesday June 26

This day comes in with a light breeze still boiling and putting oil below. Middle part the same. latter part still boiling and put some oil below.

Wednesday June 27

This day comes in with a moderate breeze from the N.E. finished boiling and cleared up deck. saw Grampases. Middle part the same. latter part light breeze from the E. and water sitting up. Oil shook and finished stowing whale below and stowing back.

Thursday June 28

This day comes in with a light breeze from the E. and water still sitting up. Oil shook and stowing back. Middle part wind the same. latter part good weather. Made all sail steering N.W.

This day comes in with a light breeze from the N.E. steering N.W. under sun down. then hauled to the wind and shortened sail. saw one merchant vessel water employed in ship duty. Middle part the same. latter part good weather. Made all sail and steered off N.W.

This day comes in with a moderate breeze from the N.E. ship cruising for whales. saw Grampases at sundown took in the main sail and light sails. Middle part the same. latter part wind very light but the light sails.

This day comes in with a very light breeze from the S.W. the vessel cruising. saw a steamer at sundown took in the light sails. the vessel leaking about the same. Middle part the same. latter part good weather. Made all sail and about 6 o'clock A.M. the ship deeper raised a large line sperm whale about 3 miles. to rendered a got our boats ready and lowered all boats and pulled (to rendered

This day comes in with a very light breeze from the S.W. at first part the boats still chasing men out of sight. of the ship came on board about 3 PM. without getting any whales. went out of sight at sundown took in the light sails.
