142 Wednesday Sept 5 Bound for Fayall
This day comes in with a light breeze
from the NW steering E. saw a Steamer
at sundown took in the light sails
Henrick Bartester is still off duty sick
middle part squally. latter part wind
hauled to the NE and squally with rain

143 Thursday Sept 6
This day comes in with a strong breeze
and heavy rain squalls from the NE.
laying to under lower topsails, nothing
in sight. middle part wind moderated
latter part light breeze made all
sail heading along by the wind

144 Friday Sept 7
This day comes in with a light breeze
from the NE heading along by the
wind. At sundown a calm. saw
a Steamer and Grampases. middle
part a calm, latter part a light
breeze made all sail heading along

145 Saturday Sept 8
This day comes in with a moderate
breeze from the S. steering E by N.
with all sail set. nothing in sight.
middle part strong breeze took in
the light sails. latter part strong
breeze from the S. steering E by N.
spoke the Whaling Ship Collin Shift

146 Sunday Sept 9
This day comes in with a gale from the
S. S. W. ship laying to under lower
topsails. saw two sails. Henrick Bartester
is still off duty. middle part a heavy rain
squall. latter part wind moderated
and hauled in to the NE. made some
sail heading along by the wind

147 Monday Sept 10
This day comes in with a moderate
breeze and a heavy swell. wind from
the NE. saw several Merchant Vessel
at sundown squally took in the upper
topsails and main sail. middle part
wind moderated. latter part a good breeze
made all sail heading along by the
wind water broke out water

148 Tuesday Sept 11
This day comes in with a good breeze
from the NW steering E by N. saw
a Steamer. at sundown took in the light
sails. water dove off new lanyards
to the port ^{lower} trypsin Rigging and set it up.
middle part laying aback. latter part
moderate breeze made all sail at
day light. saw the Islands of Flores
and Corvo about 15 miles off

149 Wednesday Sept 12
This day comes in with a moderate
breeze from the NW. about two PM
our second mate went to shore at
the Island of Flores to see his folks
came on board at sundown and
