174 Sunday Oct 7

This day comes in with a moderate breeze and rain squalls from the NW. About 10 AM the Pilot came on board and we hove our anchors up and the tug boat towed us ^{out} from the breakwaters and we made sail and left the port of Fayall. and soon after found three men that was stowed away on board of us. Middle part tacking off Pico. latter part moderate breeze working the vessel up towards the Island of Pico

175 Monday Oct 8

This day comes in with a moderate breeze from the NW. steering S.E. took for King-Antone Ferreira from forward as cook. Middle part the same. latter part took the anchors up on the bow and made them fast and sent down the upper main topsail and repaired it and sent it up again

176 Tuesday Oct 9

This day comes in with a light breeze from the NW steering S.E. by E. sent down the upper fore topsail to repair it. Some of the Islands still in sight. Middle part raining. latter part about a calm finished the upper fore topsail and bent it

177 Wednesday Oct 10

This day comes in with a moderate breeze from the S.W. heading along by the wind saw the Islands of St. Elizabeth and St. Mary and Pouspades. Middle part the same. latter part moderate breeze the Captain went in shore to try and

This day comes in with a moderate breeze from the NW steering S. by E. the Island of St. Mary still in sight. Middle part the same. latter part light breeze wind hauled into the S.W. steering along by the wind

This day comes in with a good breeze from the S.W. steering along by the wind saw a merchant vessel and Pouspades. Middle part the same. latter part strong breeze took in the main sail and fly for the upper topsails and jib
