327 Saturday Mar 9

This day comes in with a gale with heavy squalls from the NW, ship laying to under lower topsails and staysail nothing in sight. Our boat busy making a fore topmast stay sail. Middle port the same. Latter part still blowing and squally

328 Sunday Mar 10

This day comes in with a gale and rugged ship laying to under lower main top sail. Nothing in sight. Middle port the same. Latter part still blowing a gale and a heavy sea on

329 Monday Mar 11

This day comes in with a gale and heavy squalls from the E. ship heading along by the wind under lower topsails and staysails. Middle port the same. Latter part still blowing and rugged

330 Tuesday Mar 12

This day still blowing a gale from the E. ship laying to under lower topsails and staysails. Nothing in sight. Middle port the same. Latter part wind moderated some and we set the fore sail and upper main top sail and jib

331 Wednesday Mar 13

This day comes in with a strong breeze ship heading along by the wind saw Porpoises. At sundown took in the upper main top sail and jib. Middle port the same. Latter part wind moderated but the upper topsails and jib heading along by the wind

332 Thursday Mar 14

This day comes in with a good breeze from the E. ship heading along by the wind. Nothing in sight. Our boat finished the new staysail at sundown took in the upper fore top sail. Middle port the same. Latter part good weather. Made all sail cruising

333 Friday Mar 15

This day comes in with a moderate breeze ship cruising. Nothing in sight. At sundown shortened sail as usual. Middle port the same. Latter part good weather. Made all sail and steared off NW

334 Saturday Mar 16

This day comes in with a good breeze from the E. steaming PM. saw Porpoises. At sundown hauled to the wind and shortened sail as usual. Middle port the same. Latter part a good breeze, set the upper main top sail and steared off S. E. W.
