

Sunday May 3th.

These 24 hours first strong breeze from Southward course E. N. E. latter part strong breeze and squally weather course the same vessel under short sails

Monday May 4th.

These 24 hours first part blowing strong from Southward hove the vessel to: middle part blowing a fresh gale with rain squally latter part wind halled round to West moderate, made some sails and kept the course E. N. East

Tuesday May 5th

These 24 hours comes with a very heavy swell and light air from S. West course E. N. E. put up the fore top gallant yard and sail saw porpoises

Wednesday May 6th.

These 24 hours comes with calms light air and rain squally, scrub the vessel out sides

Thursday May 7th.

These 24 hours first part very light air from N. East pick up a log for wood and caught some fish; latter part fresh breeze and squally weather wind hauling to Eastward, vessel heading to Northward

Friday May 8th

These 24 hours comes with squally weather light breeze and calms saw porpoises

Saturday May 9th.

These 24 hours comes with light breezes and calms course E. by North saw plenty finbacks and porpoises

Sunday May 10th.

These 24 hours first light breezes from N. West course E. by North raised a school of middle size whales lowered the boats down but didn't get any at night the boats came aboard also saw plenty finbacks; latter part light air and calms, course E. by North saw finbacks and porpoises

Monday May 11th

These 24 hours comes with pleasant breeze from S. West course E. by North, caught two porpoises and saw finbacks on the last part sighted the pick Pico

Tuesday May 12th.

These 24 hours fresh breeze and squally weather haul up the cables and bend them on, at 6 P.M. the pilot came on board and anchored the vessel the Custom
