Wednesday May 20th.

Eastern wind, course W. by North,
broke for bread kept the same
gang of men on deck.

Thursday May 21st.

These 24 hours comes with light breeze
course W. by North, saw finbacks
and humpbacks and porpoises.
let the men have their watch below.

Friday May 22nd.

These 24 hours comes with plea-
sant weather and light S.E. wind
course W. by North. sighted a Stmr.
and saw porpoises.

Saturday May 23rd.

These 24 hours comes with pleasant
weather wind hauling round to
S.W. course W. by North, saw porpoi-
ses and got one.

Sunday May 24th.

These 24 hours comes with fine wea-
ther and light breeze from S.W.
course W. by North, latter part
steering by the wind, sighted several
sailing vessels.
