These 24 hours first part pleasant light-breeze vessel cruising two whalers in sight, sent a boat on board of American Bate to get some papers; latter part pleasant weather course S. by East sighted a whaler

Wednesday July 15<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours comes with pleasant weather and light air from N.W. course S. by East a merchant brig in sight saw porpoises

Thursday July 16<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours first part calms, middle part calms and light air; latter part cloudy weather and pleasant breeze course S. by East

These 24 hours first part pleasant weather and nice breeze from Eastward vessel heading by the wind; latter nice weather and pleasant fresh breeze in morning razed a school of small whales got the boats ready and lopped, the St. Boat got fast, then the whales brought to and the other boats got fast so they got one a piece

The whales made 66 blb.
