

Bemärker on Board of Barke

Monday July: 1st 1843

These 24 hours commence with light wind and calm weather from the westward heading to the northward the ship therein in cite at 1 P M shortened sail & the middle parte paper with light wind a compend with light rain & at 4 A M called all hands and made sail with a fresh breeze and light rain from the W S W at 6 left off E S E and continued to steer so the remainder of the 24 hours so endz

Tuesday July 2nd 1843

These 24 hours commence with fresh wind a compend with light rain from the W S W course E S E the watch employed in various jobs of shipz duty & at 1 P M shortened sail and halled on a wind heading N N W the middle parte paper with fresh wind and cloudy from the same quarter the ship laying too under short sail & at 4 A M called all hands and made sail with the wind from the westward at 5 left off E S E the latter parte paper with moderate breeze and cloudy from the N W at 10 A M saw a ship steering to the N E the watch employed in various jobs of shipz duty & so endz these 24

So endz the pleasant day of July 1843 at sea in the Lat 40° 35' Long 33° 45' W on Board of the Pt President

Wednesday July 3rd 1843

These 24 hours commence with fresh wind a compend with light squally of rain from the N W course E S E the watch employ in various jobs of shipz duty & the middle & latter parte paper with light wind and calm one sail in cite so endz these 24

Thursday July 4th 1843

These 24 hours commence with light breeze from the westward course E S E the watch employed in shipz duty & at 1 shortened sail and got the fiddle on deck and had a brack down & the boys a pear to be very lively and on hand fore dancing after there spell of sea sickness & the middle parte paper with light wind and thick wether from the westward course E S E at 4 A M called all hands and made sail with a light breeze from the westward & the latter parte paper with light breeze a compend with frequent squally of rain & the watch employed in various jobs of shipz duty so endz these 24 hours

Friday July 5th 1843

These 24 hours commence with light wind and thick wether from the westward course S E the watch employed in various jobs of shipz duty & at 1 P M shortened sail and halled on a wind heading to the southward the middle and latter parte with moderate breeze and cloudy from the northward course E S E so endz these 24 hours
