Commences moderate S.E. wind & S.W. are a cold dry breeze
38-40° during the E. wind. Weather moderate and pleasant some
48-55. Superior Promises & prospects. Looked up E.S.E. & P.S. looked to
S.W. & P.S. took in air. End of S.E. & S.W.

Andover June 12th

32-04. 5-6th birds, each one following. Pairs 2-2-2, equally in number.

38-54 ^{P.H.} Curruvies flew 2-4 and equally 8 were to southwest. flew
 forward and set for the sail. It was to Southward. But flew
 55-89 ^{P.H.} Doves and equally 2-4. three refed forward and flew at again. Each
 dove immediately and a very rapid sea going
