 First part moderate breeze but hard looking weather middle rather rainy & onshore
 Spars and dashing them up yesterday
 Saturday first part fine breeze but cloudy middle
 30 rather light squalls of wind and rain
 Sunday Oct 1st 1837
 1 first part pleasant middle rather squally and rainy
 Monday first part squalls of wind accompanied with rain middle rather at in part 1st saw charge
 Thales sends Oct 1st 1837
 Tuesday first part pleasant 2 parts 1st low
 3 ever and struck under tinned his flukes and when iron saturation again he had 2 lines and that the iron broke and at which rather rather impatient and I thought that such luck would never be again in the country middle rather pleasant employed in
 Ship duty sends Oct 1st 1837
 Wednesday first part pleasant at 1 o'clock saw a large
 4 Thales on 1st list & received my at sunset returned on 3rd thought such luck would encourage me to make wedding for it would never fetch the side and sat middle rather
 but put a net 3rd boat and between the Starboard Boat and at in part 6 raised a shot of large Thales on 1st lowered and soon struck full the shot was set up and then we chased until 11 o'clock when we returned and hungry and began to think such luck would never be again in wedding coat sent Oct 1st 1837

 Thursday first part high winds under double
 11 reef topsails middle rather calm S 1st wind S & sends Oct 1st 1837
 Friday first part high winds S & E Course
 12 S 1st under double reef topsails and double
 latter arrangement all hand below nothing to do and nobody to help them sends
 Saturday first part rainy middle and latter
 13 squally sends Oct 1st 1837
 Sunday first part pleasant all hands at work
 14 for themselves put the Starboard Boat middle rather calm employed in ripping up the old topsails that was made on board of the ship last voyage Oct 1st 1837
 Monday first part pleasant employed in patch
 15 ing the stretches out of the old topsails middle rather calm sends
 Oct 1st 1837
