

A Right Whaling on New Zealand D 1838
Friday February the 23rd

latter employed in moving the boats further aft and that routed all of the rest foggy and also employed in repairing the boat soons

Saturday first part pleasant but foggy employed the same 24 as the last 8 hours middle latter foggy until 10 when it leted a little and we saw a whale bound to windward boat soons Sat 45:43 Song 176:47 E

Sunday first part fine breeze NNE employed in mending the 25 boat and putting the iron hoops in to small casks and stowing them where the boats were left middle latter high winds rugged and foggy saw a number of whales bound to windward at the rate of knots but at 8 perceived 1 to be slow lowered and at 11 past 11 halled him alongside and began to cut soons Sat 45:44 Song 176:47 E

Monday 26 first part high winds NNE at 3 finished cutting saw another whale but he was under too much head way it being very rugged middle latter at 6 began to boil saw a whale bound to windward boat it soon became foggy and from that it began to rain soons

Tuesday first part high winds NE and rain at 1 o'clock 27 quite Boiling and fired the fore and main topsails and then up the Starboard boat middle and latter gale of wind rain storm soons

Wednesday first part fresh breeze N thick fog and a little rain 28 middle and latter Wind NNE course N foggy and whales in sight but too much wind to attack them soons Sat 45:37 Song

Thursday March the 1st D 1838

first part fine breeze SNE but rugged and foggy after dinner began to boil plenty of whales in sight and lastly but not fit to lower all the we lowered 2 boats down minutes but soon called her on board again middle latter at 7 finished Boiling whales in sight but foggy soons

Friday first part fresh breeze N and foggy employed 2 in various jobs middle latter began to break out the fore hle and put down oil at 8 lowered 2 boats and at 10 halled him alongside and began to cut soons Sat 45:49 Song 176:47 E



Saturday first part high winds S put 48 bells down in the 3 fore hse which blocked it off at 1 o'clock finished cutting and at 6 began to boil middle at 8 o'clock called all hands put out the fore pointed the boats and took in to aloat reef main topsail latter rather more moderate set, therefore sail and at 8 began to boil whales in sight soons Sat 45:37 Song 176:47 E

Sunday first part fresh breeze SSE employed in Boiling 4 and starting meet in to the Scuttle but at 3 o'clock lowered 2 boats and at 4 returned without success 1 ship in sight middle latter at 10 finished Boiling and at 11 lowered 2 boats and struck 2 whales but it very rugged we drew from them both and returned wet and abate soons Sat 45:21 Song

Monday first part high winds SNE and rugged spoke 5 the Crizemls of Peew-hedford 17 mo 3000 lbs Capt Sherman middle latter employed in stowing down oil in the after hold and whales in sight at 11 lowered and struck but soon drew it being rugged we soon returned soons Sat 45:13 Sat

Tuesday first part fresh breeze SNE employed in stowing 6 down whales in sight lowered and it proved to be a sprag middle latter at 11 past 8 lowered and at 10 halled him alongside and began to cut and at 11 lowered again and struck and he carried off the line and 2 crons soons
