

New Zealand Sunday April the 1st 1838
first part calm finished drying the loam and stowed
it below spoke the Bark Rager of New Bedford
10 months 600 of Whales and 300 of Spinn. She is now
Boiling 2 50 bls Whales middle squally latter fine
S. off heading off light sounds Sat 35:25

Monday first part fresh breeze S off heading off
2 by 1 under all sail middle latter employed in
mending the main topgallant sail and other jobs
Sat 35:37 Song 275:22

Tuesday first part fresh breeze off heading S off
3 employed in Ships duty middle heading from S E
to S off at 3 o'clock called all hands to take Ship and
took in little sail and at 6 called again and
took in to a reef main top sail thick weather and
and at 9 o'clock set cloath reefs and steered in for
the land sound

Wednesday first part blowing a gale from the Northward run
4 her off shore S E till 8 past 3 when we called
all hands here to under a 3 reef main top sail head-
ing to the Eastward middle blowing heavy Souther-
ly the Mast Boat all to smash whilst hoisted to the
top heads and turned up to and parted the wheel rope and
knocked the roundhouse all adrift latter and heaved
the foretopmast staysail latter took in the remains
of the waist boat and gave her to the Cook repair-
ed the foretopmast staysail and bent it its is now
moderate sound Sat 34:29 Song

Thursday first part blowing a decent gale S S off
5 heading S E employed in various jobs under
a 3 reef main top sail middle heavy squalls latter
at 7 with ship heading S off began to make sail
by the inches as breeze evening. no things as ever
Washington was abuilding house when he
could not spend time to tell how well he was
sound Sat 34:11

Friday April the 6th 1838
first part fresh breeze off off Course S off
employed in Ships duty saw a ship under our lee
under double reefs heading S off middle passed a
ship at 11 o'clock steering N E by N latter at 5
raised Cape Brin 4 points on the weather low heading
S off employed in Ships duty sound Sat 34:48

Saturday first part calm until 3 when there came a light
7 S off employed in various jobs middle headings
latter calm bent the chains and other jobs sound

Sunday first part light from the Northward at
8, 6 o'clock came to anchor in the Bay of Islands
middle calm latter pleasant employed in cleaning
Ship in order to Paint and other jobs sound

Monday first part pleasant carried draft of Cakes
9 on shore and filled them and 1 hog middle took in
2 tons and shalf of Potatoes latter took in draft of Water
and then on Watch went on shore and the other
employed in getting ready to Paint sound

Tuesday first part pleasant one watch on liberty
10 and the other employed in reeling the Ship
middle latter blacking the benches and other jobs
sound

Wednesday first part began to Paint the Ship but
11 it looked likely to rain and so we quitte
middle and latter rainery one Watch on liberty
sound

Thursday first part light air and rainery one
12 Watch on liberty middle and latter the same
sound on by blowing a gale S S E

Friday first part blowing half a gale N E and raining
13 one watch on liberty middle and latter the
same sound
