

Bay of Islands Saturday April the 14th 1838.
 first part agale of Wind N.E. accompanied with
 rain at 6 o'clock let go the Starboard anchor middle
 blowing and raining latter more moderate took the
 Anchor again sounds
 Sunday first part pleasant one Watch on liberty and
 15 at night 3 of them were amongst the missing
 middle latter employed in Painting Ship and
 other jobs sounds
 Monday first part pleasant employed in Painting middle
 16 latter the same sounds
 Tuesday first part pleasant finished Painting and stowed
 17 down 38 bbls off water middle latter sent craft
 of Casks on shore and filled them and other jobs
 sounds
 Wednesday first part rather rainy got up craft off
 18 water and other jobs middle and latter rather rainy
 employed in stowing down water sounds
 Thursday first part squally employed in various jobs middle
 19 latter rainy one Watch on liberty sounds
 Friday first part blowing fresh from the N.E. and raining
 20 lying with 2 anchors ahead middle and latter the
 same one of the 10 french liberty sounds
 Saturday first part adity. rather sun at night took the
 21 anchor middle latter pleasant one Watch on liberty
 sounds
 Sunday first part pleasant one Watch on liberty and 5 of them
 22 stoped on shore middle latter employed in various jobs
 sounds
 Monday first part pleasant sent 6 Casks of Oil on Shore
 23 and 8 that we filled with Water middle latter
 doing a little or nothing sounds
 Tuesday first part pleasant middle and latter the same
 24 sounds
 Wednesday first part pleasant took 1 ton of Potatoes on
 25 board middle and latter pleasant

Thursday April the 26th
 first part pleasant took one turn of Potatoes on
 board and at 5 o'clock 2 of our runaways returned
 escorted by about a dozen of natives middle
 and latter pleasant sounds
 Friday first part pleasant middle and latter the
 26 same sounds
 Saturday first part pleasant shipper 2 men and dischar
 27 O.B. got 2 one Cut his troter with aspid and the
 other was sick middle latter hove short lost the
 wine came ahead and we was obliged to shoot out
 chain again sounds
 Sunday first part fresh breeze from the Northward
 28 lying for fair wind middle and latter the same
 with plenty of rain sounds
 Monday first part wind N and rain storm lying
 29 awaiting with patience middle rainy
 latter at 8 o'clock took the Anchor with slight air
 30 that carried us just below the tarpeckers when it
 left us sounds
 Tuesday the May the 1st 1838
 1 first part light air and falling untill 4 when
 it settled N.E. and fine breeze on land the Chains are
 left the anchors on the bows steering N.E. at 6 o'clock
 Cape Brin bore N.E. distance 10 miles the Corinthian
 in company with us middle a fresh breeze at 1 o'clock
 called all hands cleast reefed the fore and mizen topsails
 and double reefed the main latter made sail employ
 ed in mending the sail boat and other jobs sounds
 Wednesday first part fresh breeze S course N.E. by E
 2 employed in mending the boat and Painter the
 larboard boat and other jobs at night took in
 sail but kept on the same course middle and
 latter blowing fresh agale of wind the Boats
 turned up and also rain storm sounds
 Sat Long
