finished mending the Boat and other jobs seen

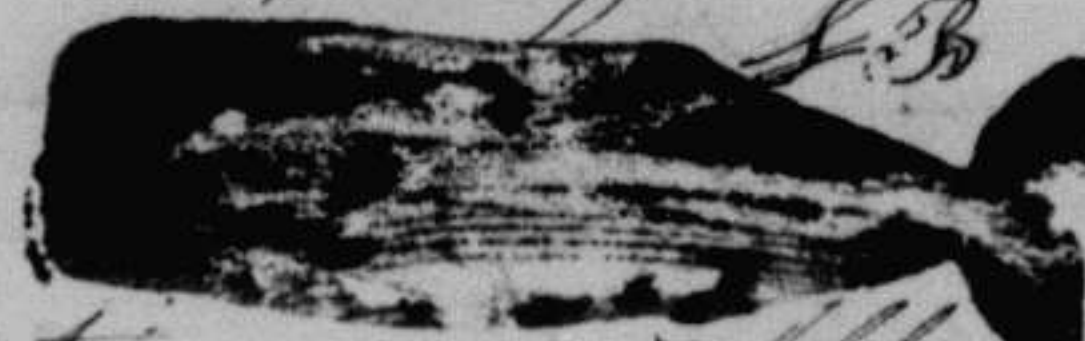

heavy squall of wind and rain middle took in sail
to abate reef. Maintop sail and foresail middle rainy
latter fresh gales and clear weather winched up the
Boats sails Sat 2.5:43 Song

Tuesday first part fresh gales and Clear heading
22 E N E wind N W middle latter more
moderate set double reef fore and maintop sail and
steamed N E employed in Ships duty seen
Sat 2.5:20

Wednesday first part alight breeze course all over the
23 coast employed in Ship duty middle latter high
wind course N E on board the Spanker and
altered it seen Sat

Thursday May the 24th 1838
first part afresh breeze heading to the
Eastward under double reefs finished the Spanker
and bent it middle latter pleasant took up the
maintop sail lifts in order to turn at 9 o'clock raised
large Whale headed to the Southward as we afterwards
followed but ^{was} lowered at the first sight at 11 struck
and soon set him spouting blue smoke

Friday first part pleasant the Boats put to as firm
25 whale which made seem much more pleas as
it is 6 months and a half since cut such a piece
at 8 o'clock hauled him alongside and made prepara-
tions for him  at 6 o'clock
middle latter began to cut but 8 7 bls has rather hard
luck seen Sat

Saturday first part alight breeze and squally
26 employed in cutting at 5 finished cutting
middle at 8 o'clock began to bail latter rather
rainy employed in Boiling seen

Sat Song
Sunday first part alight breeze S W employed
27 in Boiling spoke the Copinthon middle
and latter Boiling seen Sat 2.5:47
Song

Monday first part pleasant employed in and
28 ~~set~~ setting up Shirts middle squally
and rainy at 2 o'clock finished Boiling latter
cleared up the decks Song 2.4 5:8
Song

Tuesday first part pleasant started 8 casks
29 of Bread in to Mr Gordoners Stateroom
the Mizen topmast stay parted and we
spliced it again and other jobs ok that
ever one man was made to be called alier
by another and ^{could not} couldn't return the com-
pliment but in some more pleasant way
