

near Zealand Tuesday June the 12<sup>th</sup> 1838

Tuesday first part high winds S E under cloastreep  
12 employed in Ships duty middle latter still a  
gale filled the mizen topsail and set the main  
topsail same Sat 2.5.16 Song  
Wednesday first part blowing again from the S E  
13 parted the main spring stay, trape and put on  
another one and turned up the Boats middle  
latter the same scene Sat 2.4.17

Thursday first part blowing again S E lying under  
14 cloast reef fore and main topsail middle latter  
when we called all hands at 6 o'clock there was  
a school of Whales close by but it being too rugged  
to lower all we could do was to look at them and  
Sat 2.5.10 Song

Friday first part blowing half of again S E to the  
15 Edward under cloast reef fore and main topsail at  
1 o'clock set the foresail having not any thing  
better to do all hands employed in scrimming  
middle parted the foresail latter heavy squalls  
scene Sat 2.4.13 Song

Saturday first part blowing fresh gale S E  
16 and frequent squalls wore ship to the Southward  
and filled the foretopsail and at 4 o'clock reefed  
the foresail and set it middle squally latter  
rather more moderate wet hole and other jobs scene  
Sat Song

Sunday first part high wind S E wore ship to N E  
17 and set a cloast reef fore and mizen topsail and  
the reef out of the foresail at night filled the  
fore and mizen topsail middle and latter fresh  
gales and squally scene Sat 2.4.16

Monday first part high S E gale S E under  
18 a cloast reef main topsail at sunset reefed  
the foresail middle

Monday June the 18<sup>th</sup> 1838

After blowing harder than it had for 2 days  
before but saw the Mary under 3 cloastreep topsails  
heading to the Southward so we wore ship and  
set the fore and mizen topsail as much as she  
would bare scene Sat 2.4.18 Song

Tuesday first part part blowing S E gale backing  
19 on 3 cloast reef topsails and reef foresail middle  
latter rather more moderate set cloast reefs and the courses  
scene Sat 2.4.18 Song

Wednesday first part fine breeze S E but a heavy swell  
20 running heading to the Southward under cloast  
reefs and the courses middle latter quiet pleasant turn  
ed down the Boats and set all sail employed  
in Ships duty scene Sat 2.4.17

Thursday first part fine breeze S heading S E  
21 employed in Ships duty at night double reefed  
middle latter rather squally took in the fore and  
Boats and began to nail her over scene Sat 2.4.18

Friday first part fine breeze S E heading S E  
22 repairing the fore and Boats and some other jobs  
middle latter employed in Ships duty scene  
Sat 2.4.21 Song

Saturday first part light breeze S Course N by E  
23 set up the fore stay and broke one of the  
boats and put on hemp in its stead and  
some other jobs middle latter employed in knot  
ing the 2 of the main topmast showed scene  
Sat 2.4.24 Song

Sunday first part calm found that the fore  
24 topmast spring stay had set go and  
knotted it and other jobs scene middle  
little light air and rain until 9 o'clock  
when we had a squall from the West which  
brought her to cloast reefs scene  
Sat Song
